

Senate Resolution 735

A RESOLUTION

1 Urging metropolitan Atlanta transit authorities to join forces to establish a website; and for
2 other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, reliable and timely transportation in the metropolitan Atlanta region is of
4 primary importance to the State of Georgia; and

5 WHEREAS, there are several transit providers in the metropolitan Atlanta region, each
6 utilizing its own routing, scheduling, and payment systems; and

7 WHEREAS, a transit rider who desires to travel across county lines must visit multiple
8 websites to plan a trip; and

9 WHEREAS, transit users in the metropolitan Atlanta region would greatly benefit from the
10 creation of a website that would allow riders to plan trips, choose routes, and pay for their
11 trips all at one website; and

12 WHEREAS, the website, *www.goatltransit.com*, should be established to provide those
13 desiring to utilize Atlanta's transit operators with an easy way to plan a trip across county
14 lines; and

15 WHEREAS, metropolitan Atlanta transit authorities should make the appropriate personnel
16 and information available to achieve this important goal.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY that the
18 members of this body hereby urge the Georgia Regional Transportation Authority,
19 Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority, Cobb Community Transit, and Gwinnett
20 County Transit to work together to develop a website, to be located at *www.goatltransit.com*,
21 that allows riders to plan and pay for a trip that involves riding on one or more of the
22 participating transit systems.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Georgia Regional Transportation Authority shall
24 coordinate the efforts of these four transit entities so that the website is functioning by July 1,
25 2014.

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
27 to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to the Georgia Regional Transportation
28 Authority, Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority, Cobb Community Transit, and
29 Gwinnett County Transit.
