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## **Part 1: Information and Instructions to Respondents**

- 1. General and Background Information:** The Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (“**MARTA**”) is the ninth largest public transit system in North America, providing bus, rail and paratransit services in the greater metropolitan Atlanta area. MARTA transports over 500,000 people in the city of Atlanta and counties of Clayton, DeKalb and Fulton daily. MARTA has approximately 4,540 employees.
- 2. Services Being Procured:** MARTA is soliciting proposals from Respondents for a Contract to perform planning support and technical services on an “as needed” basis to support the development and implementation of various transit planning studies and/or projects for MARTA’s Department of Planning pursuant to the terms and conditions contained in the attached hereto Part 4 (“Contract”) and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 3. Definitions:** The following definitions shall apply when used throughout this Request for Proposals (“RFP”):
  - Respondent(s):** Each Company or aggregation of Companies (which may include a joint venture partnership, limited liability company or limited liability partnership) submitting a proposal in response to this RFP with the intent of performing the services as the prime Consultant.
  - Firm(s):** A Firm that has or will obtain, prior to the execution of any contract awarded hereunder, all necessary licenses required by the State of Georgia to perform the Services and is authorized to do business in the State of Georgia.
  - Proposal(s):** A written response to this RFP prepared by a Respondent and submitted to Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority’s (“**MARTA**”) Office of Contracts, Procurement and Materials (“**CPM**”).
- 4. Minimum Qualifications:** To participate in this procurement, Respondent must satisfy the minimum qualifications required by this RFP. Where the Respondent is a partnership, joint venture arrangement, limited liability company, limited liability partnership or other multiple entity organization, the entity that holds a majority ownership interest in the Respondent (i.e., over 50% ownership) must meet the minimum requirements set forth in this RFP. Additionally, prior to execution of the Contract, the successful Respondent will be required to demonstrate that it is duly authorized to conduct business in the State of Georgia.

No Respondent or entity comprising Respondent may submit more than one Proposal under the same or different names or as part of multiple organizations. MARTA reserves the right to disqualify any Respondent or entity comprising Respondent that submits more than one Proposal in response to this solicitation. **NOTE:** This restriction set forth in this paragraph is not applicable to sub-consultants.

By submitting a Proposal in response to this RFP, the Respondent represents and warrants to MARTA that Respondent has or will acquire all of the licenses, certifications, permits, bonding and insurance to complete the project by the time of execution of Contract.

By submitting a proposal concerning this procurement, Respondent acknowledges that it is familiar with all laws applicable to this procurement, including, but not limited to, all of MARTA's policies and procedures (as the same may change from time to time), all of which is incorporated into this RFP by this reference.

5. **No Offer by MARTA; Firm Offer by Respondent:** This procurement does not constitute an offer by MARTA to enter into an agreement and cannot be accepted by any Respondent to form an agreement. This procurement is only an invitation for offers from interested Respondents and no offer or proposal shall bind MARTA. However, Respondent's offer is a firm offer to MARTA for a period of **180 calendar days** from the Proposal Deadline and may not be withdrawn during such 180-day time period.
6. **Pre-Proposal Conference:** A pre-proposal conference is scheduled for **June 26, 2017 at 10:00 a.m. (local time)** at the MARTA's headquarters building located at 2424 Piedmont Road N.E., Atlanta, Georgia 30324-3330. Respondents are advised that notwithstanding the address, MARTA's headquarters building is located west of Piedmont Road on Morosgo Drive across from the Lindbergh Rail Station. Attendance at the pre-proposal conference is not required but is strongly encouraged. Each Respondent is responsible for being fully informed regarding all existing and expected conditions and matters that may affect the cost or the performance of the Services. Any failure to fully investigate the requirements of this RFP shall not relieve any Respondent from the responsibility to properly estimate the difficulty or cost of successfully performing the Services being sought under this RFP.
7. **Additional Documentation:** Each Respondent, if successful, acknowledges and agrees to submit such additional documentation (e.g., insurance/bonds, etc.) promptly after an award pursuant to any notice provided by MARTA and as required by the terms of this RFP and the Contract.
8. **Procurement Questions; Prohibited Contacts:** Any questions regarding this procurement **must** be submitted in writing to MARTA's contact person, Mr. Reginald Bryant via electronic mail [Rebryant@itsmarta.com](mailto:Rebryant@itsmarta.com), on or before **June 30, 2017. Questions submitted after 5:00 p.m. (local time) will not be considered by MARTA.** Any response made by MARTA will be provided in writing to all Respondents by posting the same to MARTA's website at [www.itsmarta.com](http://www.itsmarta.com). It is the responsibility of each Respondent to obtain a copy of all responses and/or any addenda issued for this procurement by monitoring MARTA's website. No Respondent may rely on any verbal response to any question concerning this procurement. All Respondents (and any representative thereof) are strictly prohibited from contacting any MARTA employees (or third-party representatives or consultants of MARTA) on any matter having to do with this procurement. All communications by any Respondent **must** be made with MARTA's contact person or any other MARTA employees or representatives designated by the head of MARTA's Contracts, Procurement and Materials Department.
9. **Proposal Deadline:** To be considered responsive, a Respondent must complete and submit its Proposal and all required submittals and attachments in accordance with the instructions contained or referenced in this RFP. All responses to this RFP must be received by MARTA's Department of Contracts & Procurement and Materials, 2400 Piedmont Road N.E., Atlanta, Georgia 30324-3330, on or before **August 11, 2017 at 2:00 p.m. (local time)**. Any Proposal received after this time will not be considered/reviewed and will be rejected and returned.

## 10. Required Submittals:

- a. **Forms 1a, 1b, and 1c: Illegal Immigration Reform and Enforcement Act.** Each Respondent must complete and submit a Consultant's Affidavit with its proposal. This RFP is subject to the Illegal Immigration Reform and Enforcement Act of 2011 ("**Act**"), as amended. Pursuant to the Act, the Respondent must provide with its proposal proof of its registration with and continuing and future participation in the E-Verify program established by the United States Department of Homeland Security. Under state law, MARTA cannot consider any proposal which does not include a completed Consultant's Affidavit. It is not the intent of this notice to provide detailed information or legal advice concerning the Act. All Respondents intending to do business with MARTA are responsible for independently apprising themselves of and complying with the requirements of the Act and assessing its effect on MARTA procurements and their participation in those procurements. - b. **Form 2: Acknowledgement of Addenda.** Each Respondent must complete and submit an acknowledgement with its Proposal that it has received all Addenda issued by MARTA for this RFP. This form is provided and may be used to satisfy this requirement.

- d. **Form 4: No Conflict of Interest.** Each Respondent must furnish with their proposal the information called for by the form. If the form is omitted or if the information furnished is incomplete or inadequate, the Authority may require that additional information be submitted after the Proposal deadline and before an award is made.
- e. **Form 5: List of Proposed Sub-Consultants.** Each Respondent is requested to furnish with their proposal the information called for by the form. If the form is omitted or if the information furnished is incomplete or inadequate, the Authority may require that additional information be submitted after the proposal deadline and before an award is made.
- f. **Form 6: Respondent's Qualification and Business References.** Each Respondent is requested to furnish with their proposal the information called for by the form. If the form is omitted or if the information furnished is incomplete or inadequate, the Authority may require that additional information be submitted after the proposal deadline and before an award is made.
- g. **Form 7: Client List.** Each Respondent is requested to furnish with their proposal the information called for by the form.
- h. **Form 8: Certification of Primary Participant Regarding Debarment, Suspension, and Other Responsibility Matters.** Each Respondent must furnish with their proposal the information called for by the form.
- i. **Form 9: Certification of Lower-Tier Participant Regarding Debarment, Suspension, and Other Responsibility Matters.** Each Respondent must furnish with their proposal the information called for by the form.
- j. **Form 10: Certification Regarding Lobbying.** Each Respondent must furnish with their proposal the information called for by the form.

- k. **Form 11: Disclosure of Lobbying Activities.** Each Respondent must furnish with their proposal the information called for by the form.
- l. **Appendix A: Office of Diversity and Inclusion Requirements.** MARTA's Department of Diversity and Inclusion ("DNI") program(s) applicable to this procurement and any Contract that may be awarded pursuant to this procurement are set forth in **Appendix A** attached hereto. Each Respondent must furnish the information requested by **Appendix A** with their proposal.

**11. Ownership of Proposals:** Each proposal submitted to MARTA will become the property of MARTA, without compensation to a Respondent, for MARTA's use, in MARTA's sole discretion.

**12. Proposal Evaluation, Award and Multiple Awards:**

- a. Upon receipt and review of the Proposals, MARTA shall determine which Respondent(s) are responsive and responsible. MARTA will notify each Respondent in writing of MARTA's determination. After the Proposal Deadline, MARTA's Source Evaluation Committee ("**SEC**") will evaluate each responsive proposal in accordance with the evaluation criteria described in this RFP. If MARTA elects to award this RFP, MARTA will award the same to the most responsive and responsible Respondent(s) that submits a proposal that is in the best interest of MARTA to accept. Respondent(s) may be required to make an oral presentation to the SEC at any stage of the selection and evaluation process.
- b. Respondents may submit a proposal for one or all services being requested. The selection of the successful Respondent(s), if any, will be based on the following criteria in each of the three (3) areas, which are listed in descending order of importance.:

- I. **Corridor/Facility/ Joint Development Planning Support Services**

- II. **Transit Planning Support Services**

- a) Project understanding for corridor planning, facility planning, joint development planning and transit planning;
- b) Technical capabilities and professional qualifications;
- c) Specialized experience in required disciplines;
- d) Demonstrated capability to perform work on schedule and within budget;
- e) Past performances on contracts to include control of cost, quality of work, and ability to meet schedules;
- f) Key personnel and their commitment to the project;
- g) Organizational/management concept to accomplish the work;
- h) Ability to demonstrate effective Quality Assurance Program; and
- i) DBE involvement

- III. **Transit Oriented Development (TOD) & Real Estate Valuation**

- a) Technical capabilities and professional qualifications;
- b) Project understanding;
- c) Demonstrated capability to perform work on schedule and within budget;

- d) Past performances on Contracts to include cost control, quality of work, and ability to meet schedules;
- e) Key personnel and their commitment to the project;
- f) Specialized experience in required disciplines;
- j) Organizational/management concept to accomplish the work;
- k) Ability to demonstrate effective Quality Assurance Program.
- g) DBE involvement

### 13. Submission of Proposals:

- a. Proposals must be submitted according to the requirements of this RFP. All blank spaces must be typed or hand written in blue or black ink.
- b. Proposals shall be signed by hand by a principal of the Respondent with the authority to bind the Respondent and enter into an agreement with MARTA. Joint ventures or partnerships must designate one joint venture member/partner to represent the joint venture or partnership, respectively, with the authority to submit and execute a Proposal, bind the entity as well as enter into an agreement with MARTA. Each Respondent is responsible for the preparation of its Proposal and for the costs associated therewith.
- c. Each Respondent must submit a complete proposal in accordance with the requirements of this RFP. The format for the submission of a proposal mandated by this RFP is not negotiable. The name and number of the project is: **RFP P39820: Planning Support and Technical Services**. Proposals must be submitted in sealed envelope(s) or package(s) and the outside of the envelope(s) or package(s) must clearly identify the name of the Project, Project Number, Respondent's Name and address, and Respondent's Federal Work Authorization User Identification Number. - d. **Proposals must be submitted to the above address between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. (local time) Monday through Friday. Proposals will not be accepted on the following days: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King, Jr's birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, the day after Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. Any Proposal received after this time will not be considered and will be rejected and returned.**
- e. Respondents should arrive well in advance of the deadline set forth herein because all packages/deliveries to MARTA are scanned prior to acceptance thereof. Respondents should allocate adequate time to have their package scanned so the same is received by MARTA prior to the deadline set forth herein.

- f. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the project shall not be contingent upon Respondent obtaining public funding.
- g. A Respondent **must** submit one (1) original, marked "Original", and sixteen (16) individual USB drive [a.k.a., jump or flash drive]) with a copy of its proposal or each flash drive. The Respondent's USB drive copy should be submitted in an unlocked Portable Document Format (i.e. pdf). Each proposal must be submitted on 8-½" x 11" double-sided, typed pages, using 12-point font size and such pages must be inserted in a standard three-hole ring binder. To the extent Respondent requires a larger page size to demonstrate its experience, MARTA will accept 11"x 17" sheet size but it must be folded to 8-1/2" x 11" size. Each proposal must contain an index and separate sections for the information requirements set forth in this RFP, as well as for the forms required to be submitted.
- h. Each Respondent shall promptly notify MARTA in writing, prior to the proposal due date, should the Respondent find discrepancies, errors, ambiguities or omissions in any of Respondent's proposal documents or should the intent or meaning set forth in Respondent's proposal documents appear unclear or ambiguous.
- i. Each Respondent shall promptly notify MARTA in writing should the Respondent find discrepancies, errors, ambiguities or omissions in any of the RFP documents prior to the end of the question/comment period set forth herein. MARTA will reply to such notices, if necessary, by issuing an addendum to the RFP. It is the responsibility of each Respondent to obtain a copy of any addendum issued for this RFP by monitoring MARTA's website at [www.itsmarta.com](http://www.itsmarta.com).

**14. Rejection of Proposals; Cancellation of RFP; Waiver of Technicalities:** MARTA reserves the right to reject any Proposal or all Proposals or to waive any technical defect in a Proposal before or after Proposal submission. MARTA also reserves the right to cancel this RFP at any time for any reason or no reason. Additionally, MARTA may, by addendum, modify any provision or part of this RFP at any time prior to the Proposal due date and time. The Respondent shall not rely on oral clarifications to the RFP unless they are confirmed, in writing, by MARTA in an issued addendum. MARTA also reserves the right to award based upon a Respondent's original submission without discussion.

**15. Georgia Open Records Act:** Information provided to MARTA is subject to disclosure under the Georgia Open Records Act ("**GORA**"). Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72(a)(34), "*[a]n entity submitting records containing trade secrets that wishes to keep such records confidential under this paragraph shall submit and attach to the records an affidavit affirmatively declaring that specific information in the records constitute trade secrets pursuant to Article 27 of Chapter 1 of Title 10 [O.C.G.A. § 10-1-760 et seq.].*"

**16. Representation:** By submitting a Proposal in response to this RFP, Respondent acknowledges and represents that: (a) the accompanying Proposal is made by a person or business entity that is neither a high cost lender nor a predatory lender, nor is the Respondent an affiliate of a high cost lender or a predatory lender, as defined by the Official Code of Georgia Annotated ("**Code**") Section 58-102; (b) it has read all of the RFP documents (including, without limitation, the Contract) and acknowledges that, if successful, Respondent shall be bound by the requirements stated therein; (c) the signatory to the Proposal is the Respondent (or Respondent's duly authorized agent or employee of the Respondent with the authority to bind Respondent hereto); (d) any information or disclosure provided in response to this RFP are fully restated herein and remain truthful and

accurate representations up to and including the date Respondent submits its proposal to MARTA; (e) MARTA will not agree to make any substantive revisions to the Contract; (f) it will be bound by MARTA's Code of Ethics available at <http://www.itsmarta.com/Code-of-Ethics-Revised-8-12-2013.pdf>, as the same may be amended from time to time in MARTA's sole discretion; and (g) it agrees that it will voluntarily notify MARTA immediately if any information or disclosure provided to MARTA during any part of this procurement process changes, is no longer accurate or would be misleading in any way.

By submitting a Proposal in response to this RFP, Respondent is representing and warranting to MARTA that none of the following, during the term of the Contract or for one (1) year thereafter, have or will have any interest, direct or indirect, in the Contract or in any part of the proceeds, therefor: (a) members of the MARTA Board of Directors; (b) officers or employees or former employees of MARTA, or of any representative of MARTA in the administration of this Contract, pursuant to MARTA's Code of Ethics. This Section also applies to members of or delegates to the United States Congress or the Georgia legislature; and members of the governing body, and all other officers and employees, of the City of Atlanta or the counties of Clayton, DeKalb or Fulton.

**17. Protests:** Any protest or objection to this RFP or the solicitation process related to this RFP must be submitted, in a timely manner, in accordance with the Protest Procedures set forth on MARTA's website at <http://www.itsmarta.com/Protest-10359.pdf>.

**18. Equal Employment Opportunity and Disadvantaged Business Utilization:** All Respondents are (a) strongly encouraged to consider the use of Disadvantaged Business Enterprises ("DBE(s)") in all aspects of the Contract that will be awarded pursuant to this solicitation process and (b) will be required to document their good faith efforts in this regard as an integral part of their Proposal. Refer to the Equal Employment Opportunity and Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Requirements.

MARTA has assigned a **25%** goal for Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) participation in this project, the Respondent agrees and warrants that Respondent:

(a) Not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age, or national origin; (b) comply with all the provisions of Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations and other relevant orders of the US Secretary of Labor, and Respondent will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as well as, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act effective June 12, 1968, and will permit access to books, records and accounts by the Authority, the Secretary of Labor and/or the Secretary of Transportation, for purposes of investigation to ascertain Respondent's compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders; (c) take affirmative action to assure that Disadvantaged Business Enterprises are strongly pursued for participation on this contract and will document their best efforts to ascertain DBE participation in different aspects of the project as an integral part of their submitted Proposal. The breach of any of the foregoing agreements and warranties shall be a material breach of this contract, for which MARTA, in addition to all other remedies, shall have the right to cancel the contract; and (d) provide MARTA with a written copy of its equal opportunity policy statement if less than fifty (50) employees and a copy of

current written affirmative action plan if fifty (50) or more employees, which will be accomplished prior to Contract award.

**19. Environmental Purchasing:** MARTA desires to use Environmentally Preferable Purchasing (EPP) criteria when making purchases for commodities and services. Environmentally Preferable Purchasing refers to securing products that have a lesser or reduced effect on human health and the environment when compared with competing products that serve the same purpose. These products minimize the consumption of resources, energy and water; prevent the creation of solid waste, air pollution or water pollution; minimize the use of materials or processes which compromise the environment; and/or promote the use of non-toxic substances and avoid toxic materials or processes.

(a) Twelve basic categories are used to provide guidance as to what constitutes an environmentally preferable product. These categories include:

- (1) Alternative Energy Source
- (2) Bio-Based
- (3) Biodegradable
- (4) Compostable
- (5) High Recycled Content
- (6) Low Toxicity
- (7) Low Volatile Organic Compound (VOC)
- (8) Pollution (air, water, solid waste) Reduction
- (9) Recyclable
- (10) Repairable
- (11) Resource Efficient (water conserving and/or energy efficient)
- (12) Reusable

(b) In an effort to promote greater use of recycled and environmentally preferable products and minimize waste, all Proposals submitted should comply with the following guidelines:

- (i) All copies should be printed double-sided.
- (ii) All submittals and copies should be printed on recycled paper with a minimum post-consumer content of 30% or on tree-free paper (i.e., paper made from raw materials other than trees, such as kenaf). All Proposals should note the level of recycled content contained in the paper being used.
- (iii) Unless absolutely necessary, all Proposals and copies should minimize or eliminate the use of non-recyclable or non-reusable materials, such as plastic report covers, plastic dividers, vinyl sleeves and GBC binding. Three-ringed binders, glued materials, paper clips and staples are acceptable.
- (iv) Respondents should submit materials in a format that allows for easy removal and recycling of paper materials.
- (v) Respondents are encouraged to use other products that contain recycled content in their Proposal documents. Such products may include, but are not limited to, folders, binders, paper clips, discs, envelopes, boxes, etc. Where appropriate, Respondents may wish to note which products in their Proposals are made with recycled materials.
- (vi) Unnecessary samples, attachments or documents not specifically asked for should not be submitted with the Proposals.



**20. Electronic Solicitation Documents:** This RFP is being made available to all Respondents by electronic means. By responding to this RFP, Respondent acknowledges and accepts full responsibility to ensure that it is responding to the correct form of RFP, including any addenda issued by MARTA's Department of Contracts, Procurement and Materials. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that in the event of a conflict between the RFP in the Respondent's possession and the version maintained by MARTA's Department of Contracts, Procurement and Materials, the version maintained by MARTA's Department of Contracts, Procurement and Materials shall govern. **21. Award of Contract; Execution:** If MARTA awards a Contract pursuant to this procurement, MARTA will prepare and forward to the successful Respondent(s) a Contract for execution substantially in the form included in solicitation document.

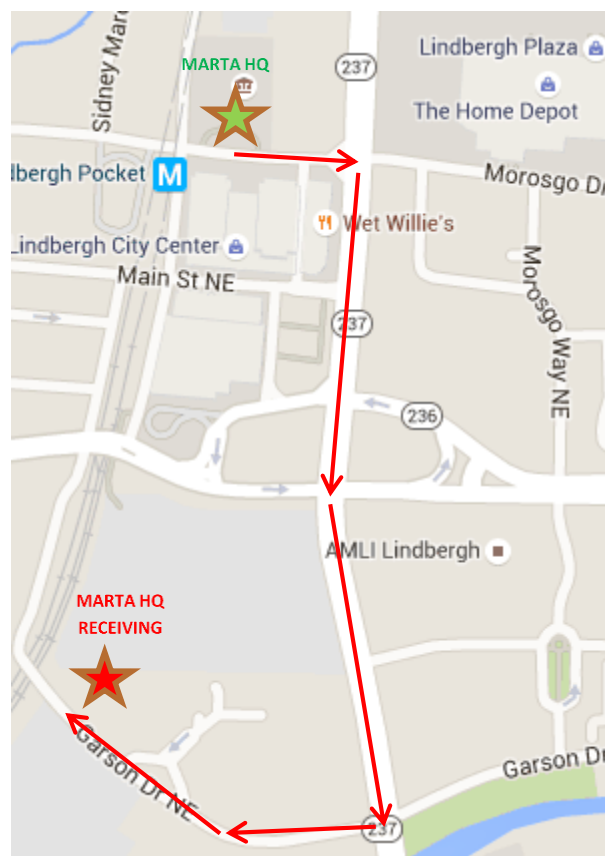

This document is issued pursuant to *Title VI* and *Title VII* of the *Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended*, the *Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990, as amended*, *Environmental Justice Executive Order No. 12898*, *Executive Order 11246*, *Executive Order 11625*, *49 CFR Part 23 and 26*, and the MARTA Board Policies on equal employment opportunity (Exhibit A), and the utilization of disadvantaged business enterprises (Exhibit B). The Contractor is required to take certain actions designed to assure equitable participation of minority persons and women in its work force, as well as the maximization of opportunities for disadvantaged business enterprises.

Part I details the equal employment opportunity requirements; Part II outlines the disadvantaged business utilization requirements; and Part III requires the Contractor's employment data, details on disadvantaged business utilization, and certification.

**PART I - EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY (EEO)**

**A. Utilization Analysis**

1. This submittal requirement is applicable to each entity, including each separate partnership, corporation, company, joint venture, or other entity, regardless of its level of participation, comprising the business organizations or entities submitting the bid(s). Each Contractor, desirous of doing business with the Authority, shall be required to submit a current affirmative action program if their workforce is 50 or more employees. The affirmative action program should include a utilization analysis by job category, an underutilization analysis, a program of goals and timetables to correct any such underutilization, and other data called for by the Authority's Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity. A current Equal Employment Opportunity Policy statement is required if the Contractor's workforce is less than 50 employees.

**B. Underutilization Analysis**

1. "Underutilization" is defined as employing fewer minorities in a particular job category than would reasonably be expected between their availability in the general population, or fewer women in a particular job category than would reasonably be expected based on their availability in the labor market. In determining whether minorities or women are being underutilized in any job category, the Contractor will consider all of the following factors:
  - a. The minority population of the area encompassed by the MARTA system;
  - b. The size of the minority and female unemployment force in the labor area encompassed by the MARTA system;

- c. The percentage of minority and female work forces as compared with the total work force in the labor area encompassed by the MARTA system;
- d. The general availability of minorities and women having requisite skills in the labor area encompassed by the MARTA system;
- e. The availability of minorities and women having requisite skills in an area from which the Contractor can reasonably recruit;
- f. The availability of promotable minority and female employees within the Contractor's organization;
- g. The anticipated expansion, contraction and turnover in the work force;
- h. The existence of training institutions capable of training minorities and women in the requisite skills; and
- i. The degree of training which the Contractor is reasonably able to undertake as a means of making all job classes available to minorities and women.

### **C. Goals and Timetables**

1. In the event there is an underutilization of minority or female employees, the Contractor shall also be required to include in its affirmative action plan, a program, including goals and timetables, for correcting these deficiencies.
2. An effective affirmative action program shall contain, but not necessarily be limited to, the following elements: (a) development or reaffirmation of the Contractors' equal employment opportunity policy in all personnel actions; (b) formal internal and external dissemination of the Contractors' policy; (c) establishment of responsibilities for implementation of the Contractor's affirmative action program; (d) identification of underutilization by organizational units and job categories; (e) where underutilization occurs, development and execution of a program establishing corrective and affirmative goals and objectives by organizational units and job category, including timetables for completion; (f) design and implementation of internal audit and reporting systems to measure effectiveness of the total program; (g) internal active support of local and national community action programs. Support data for the above analysis and program shall be compiled and maintained as part of the affirmative action program. This data should include progression line charts, seniority rosters, applicant flow data, and applicant rejection ratios indicating minority and female status.
3. Goals shall be targets reasonably attainable by means of applying every good faith effort to make all aspects of the entire affirmative action program work. The use of goals is not intended and should not be used to discriminate against any applicant or employee because of race, color, religion, sex or national origin.

### **D. Reports**

1. All Contractors doing business with the Authority shall submit at least quarterly reports as may be requested by the Executive Director, Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity or a designee. Such employment reports shall include such information

as to the practices, policies, programs, and statistics of the Contractor, and shall be in such form, as the Authority may prescribe.

#### **E. Subcontractors**

1. Subcontractors are bound by the same requirements as Contractors, who shall be responsible for the compliance of their Lower tier contractors.

#### **F. Responsibility for Implementation**

1. Each Contractor shall designate, and notify the Authority of the person who will be responsible for implementing its equal opportunity policy and plan.

#### **G. Compliance**

1. The Contractor agrees to comply, and assures the compliance of each sub recipient, lessee, third party contractor, or other participants at any tier of the Project, with all equal employment opportunity (EEO) provisions of 49 U.S.C. § 5332, with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, 49 U.S.C. § 2000e, and implementing Federal regulations and any later amendments thereto. Except to the extent FTA determines otherwise in writing, the Contractor also agrees to follow all applicable Federal EEO directives that may be issued.
2. Failure to comply with the Authority's Equal Employment Opportunity policy may constitute cause for cancellation or termination of the contract and may render a Contractor ineligible for future contracts with the Authority. Immediately upon finding that a Contractor is in noncompliance, the Authority shall issue a notice to the Contractor giving it thirty (30) days to show cause why the contract should not be terminated. If the Contractor fails to develop and implement an acceptable affirmative action program within thirty (30) days, the Authority shall issue a notice of proposed cancellation or termination of existing contracts and subcontracts and debarment from future contracts and subcontracts. The Contractor shall have ten (10) days to request a hearing. If a request has not been received in ten (10) days, the Contractor will be declared ineligible for future contracts and contracts will be terminated for default.
3. During the "show cause" period of thirty (30) days, every effort shall be made by the Authority through conciliation, mediation and persuasion to resolve the deficiencies that led to the determination of noncompliance.
4. Any prime Contractor or Subcontractor declared ineligible for further contracts or subcontracts may request reinstatement in a letter directed to the Authority. In connection with the reinstatement proceeding, the prime Contractor or Subcontractor shall be required to show that it has established and will carry out employment policies and practices in compliance with the Equal Employment Opportunity requirements.

#### **H. Records**

1. The Contractor and Subcontractor shall permit access to their books, records, and accounts by OFCCP, the Federal DOT, or the Federal Transit Administration and



the Authority's Executive Director, Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity or a designated representative for purpose of investigation to ascertain compliance with the foregoing requirements.

**I. Federal Nondiscrimination Provisions Pursuant to 41 CFR Part 60-1.4(b)**

During the performance of this contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:

1. The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color, sex or national origin. The Contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated equitably during employment without regard to their race, religion, color, sex, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, promotion, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees, and applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
2. The Contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, sex or national origin.
3. 5. The Contractor will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (I.1) and the provisions of paragraphs (I.1) through (I.7), in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to Section 204 of *Executive Order* 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each Subcontractor or vendor. The Contractor will take such action with respect to any Subcontractor or purchase order as the Administering Agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance. Provided, however, that in the event a Contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a Subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the Administering Agency, the Contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

**J. Federal Nondiscrimination Provisions Pursuant to 49 CFR Part 21.**

During the performance of the Contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:

1. The Contractor shall comply with the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination in Federally assisted programs of the Department of Transportation (DOT) Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21, as they may be amended from time to time (hereafter referred to as the Regulations), which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of the contract.
2. The Contractor, with regard to the work performed by it during the Contract, shall not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, sex, creed or national origin in the selection and retention of Subcontractors, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment. The Contractor shall not participate, either directly or indirectly, in the discrimination prohibited by Section 21.5 of the Regulations, including employment practices when the Contract covers a program set forth in Appendix B of the Regulations.
3. In all solicitations, either by competitive bidding or negotiation, made by the Contractor for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, each potential Subcontractor or supplier shall be notified by the Contractor of the Contractor's obligations under the Contract and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, color, sex, creed or national origin.
4. The Contractor shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations and directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information and its facilities as may be determined by the Authority or the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations, orders, and instructions. Where any information required of a Contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, the Contractor shall so certify to the Authority, or the Federal Transit Administration, as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.
5. In the event of the Contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of this Contract, the Authority shall impose such contract sanctions as it or the Federal Transit Administration may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:

- a. Withholding of payments to the Contractor under the contract until the Contractor complies, and/or
  - b. Cancellation, termination or suspension of the contract, in whole or in part.
6. The Contractor shall include the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (J.1) and the provisions of paragraph (J.1) through (J.6) in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Regulations, or directives issued pursuant thereto. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontract or procurement as the Authority or the Federal Transit Administration may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance. Provided, however, that, in the event a Contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a Subcontractor or Supplier as a result of such direction, the Contractor may request the Authority to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the Authority, and, in addition, the Contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

## **PART II - UTILIZATION OF DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES**

### **A. Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Participation Contract Specifications Pursuant to *Executive Order 11625*, 49 CFR Part and 26, and MARTA Policy.**

1. It is the policy of the Federal Government and the Authority to ensure a "level playing field" and foster equal opportunity for small businesses pursuant to the Department of Transportation's 49 CFR Part 26. In this regard, the Contractor to whom any award of this solicitation is made shall take all necessary and reasonable steps in accordance with this solicitation to ensure that disadvantaged business enterprises have a "level playing field" and foster equal opportunity for small businesses. The contractor, sub recipient or subcontractor shall not discriminate on the bases of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this contract. The contractor shall carry out applicable requirement of 49 CFR Part 26 in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts. Failure by the contractor to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this contract, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy as the recipient deems appropriate. The Contractor shall use its best efforts to carry out the DBE policy consistent with efficient performance on the project.
2. Contractors are hereby informed that the Authority will consider the establishment of goals for the participation of disadvantaged business enterprises in all contracts it awards. Subsequently, any Subcontracts awarded by the Contractor successful in this solicitation to firms owned by disadvantaged persons, and to joint ventures of which such firms are a part, are essential to the achievement of the Authority's DBE goal. Therefore to be considered for award, Contractors must comply with the requirements of this Part II. By submitting his/her bid, each Contractor gives assurance that he/she will meet the Authority's percentage goal target set forth in Parts II.A.3 for participation by disadvantaged business enterprises in the performance of any contract resulting from this solicitation or, as an alternative, that he has made or will make good faith efforts toward meeting the DBE goals, and will demonstrate to the Authority's satisfaction that he/she has made such efforts.

Contractors are encouraged to submit with their bids, on the form set in Part III.B, the names, respective scope of work, and the dollar values of each DBE Subcontractor that the Contractor proposes for participation in the contract. In any case, this information shall be submitted within such time as the Authority requires. If the information so submitted indicates that the Authority's goals will not be met, the Contractor shall also submit **Exhibit G**, to show sufficient evidence to the Authority's satisfaction that the Contractor has in good faith made every reasonable effort, in the Authority's judgment, to meet such goals. Examples of efforts that may be appropriate are found in Part II.A.5. If any Contractor fails to submit, within the time stipulated or any extension the Authority may allow, the required information concerning DBE participation, or if, having failed to meet the Authority's goals or fails to demonstrate to the Authority's satisfaction his/her good faith efforts to do so, the Authority may, in its discretion, reject his/her contract.

**3. Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Goals.**

**The Authority has established a DBE contract goal of \*0% of the total dollar value of the bid total, including amendments, modifications, options and change orders. Credit towards the DBE goal for a contract shall be limited to the participation of firms performing within the designated NAICS code(s) for which the firms have been certified as a DBE.**

4. The Contractor must promptly notify MARTA's Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity, whenever a DBE subcontractor, performing work related to this contract, is terminated or fails to complete its work, and must make good faith efforts to engage another DBE subcontractor to perform at least the same amount of work. The Contractor may not terminate any DBE subcontractor and perform that work through its own forces or those of an affiliate without prior written consent of MARTA's Executive Director of Diversity and Equal Opportunity.
5. Contractors are informed that price alone does not constitute an acceptable basis for rejecting DBE quotes unless the Contractor can demonstrate that no reasonable price can be obtained from a DBE. A Contractor's failure to meet the DBE goal or to show reasonable efforts to that end will, in the Authority's discretion, constitute sufficient grounds for rejecting his/her proposal. Such reasonable efforts may include, but are not limited to, some or all of the following:
  - a. Attendance at the pre-proposal conference if any;
  - b. Follow-up of initial solicitations of interest in a timely fashion by contacting DBEs to determine with certainty whether the DBEs are interested;
  - c. Efforts made to select portions of the work (including, where appropriate, breaking down contracts into economically feasible units) proposed to be performed by DBEs in order to increase the likelihood of achieving the DBE goals;

- d. Efforts to negotiate with DBEs for specific subcontracts, including at a minimum:
  - (i) The names, addresses, and telephone numbers of DBEs that were contacted;
  - (ii) A description of the information provided to DBEs regarding the plans and specifications for portions of the work to be performed; and
  - (iii) A detailed statement of the reasons why additional prospective agreements with DBEs, needed to meet the stated goals, were not reached;
- e. Advertisement in general circulation media, trade association publications and disadvantaged-focus media for a reasonable period before bids are due;
- f. Notification, in writing, to a reasonable number of specific DBEs that their interests in specifically delineated contract work is solicited, in sufficient time to allow the DBEs to participate effectively;
- g. Concerning each DBE the Contractor contacted but rejected as unqualified, the reasons for the Contractor's conclusion;
- h. Efforts made to assist the DBEs contacted that needed assistance in obtaining bonding, lines of credit, or insurance required by the Contractor or the Authority;
- i. Designation, in writing, of a liaison officer who administers the Contractor's disadvantaged business enterprise utilization program;
- j. Expansion of search for DBEs to a wider geographic area than the area in which the Contractor generally seeks Subcontractors, if use of the customary solicitation area does not result in meeting the goals by the Contractor; and
- k. Utilization of services of available disadvantaged community organizations; disadvantaged Contractors' groups; local, state, and federal minority business technical assistance offices; and other organizations that provide assistance in the recruitment and placement of DBEs.

5. **Disadvantaged Business Enterprise** means a small business concern owned and controlled by a socially and economically disadvantaged individual or individuals. For purposes of this definition:

- a. Small business size standards vary by type of industry. Contractors should refer to 13 CFR, Part 121, for current standards. Disadvantaged business enterprise firms will be considered ineligible and will be graduated from the disadvantaged enterprise program if their average annual gross receipts over the preceding three fiscal years exceed \$22,410,000.
- b. An individual is socially disadvantaged if (i) he or she is a citizen of the United States or a lawfully admitted permanent resident, and (ii) because of his or her

race, color, national origin, gender, physical handicap or mental disability, long term residence in an environment isolated from the mainstream of American society, or other similar cause beyond the individual's control, he or she has been negatively affected with respect to his or her entry into or advancement in the business world.

- c. A socially disadvantaged individual is economically disadvantaged if he or she and his or her business are in a more difficult economic situation than most businesses and owners that are not socially disadvantaged.
  - d. Any group or individual may, upon a proper showing, be found to be socially and economically disadvantaged. There is a presumption, which, however, may be rebutted by evidence of any appropriate kind, that members of the following groups are socially and economically disadvantaged; (i) "Black Americans," which includes persons having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa; (ii) "Hispanic Americans," which includes persons of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish or Portuguese culture or origin, regardless of race; (iii) "Native Americans," which includes persons whose origins are American Indians, Eskimos, or Native Hawaiians; (iv) "Asian-Pacific Americans," which includes persons whose origin are from Japan, China, Taiwan, Korea, Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, the Philippines, Samoa, Guam, the U.S. Trust Territories of the Pacific, or the Northern Marianas; (v) "Asian-Subcontinental Americans," which includes persons whose origins are from India, Pakistan, or Bangladesh; and (vi) "Women," regardless of race, ethnicity, or origin.
  - e. Owned and Controlled means a business (i) which is at least 51 per cent owned by one or more disadvantaged persons or women or, in the case of a publicly owned business, at least 51 per cent of the stock of which is owned by one or more disadvantaged persons or women, and (ii) whose management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more such individuals.
  - f. The definition of a disadvantaged business enterprise is in Part II.A.5 based upon DOT regulation 49 CFR Part and 26 as amended. The Contractor agrees to abide by this DOT regulation and any subsequent amendments thereto affecting the foregoing definition.
6. The Contractor may rely on written representation by Subcontractors regarding their status as disadvantaged business enterprises in lieu of an independent investigation, however:
- a. Prior to award of this contract, as requested by the Authority, Contractors shall cause disadvantaged business enterprises and joint ventures involving disadvantaged businesses to submit, through the Contractor, appropriate certification to the Authority as shown in the Disadvantaged Business Disclosure Requirements (Exhibits D and E). On the basis of these disclosures and any other relevant information, should the Authority determine any firm to not be a legitimate DBE, Contractors shall be permitted to substitute bona fide DBEs for the Authority's consideration.
  - b. After proposal deadline and during contract performance, Contractors are required to make every reasonable effort to replace a DBE Subcontractor that is unable to perform successfully, with another DBE. Prior to

substituting a DBE which is not performing satisfactorily, the Contractor shall seek written approval from the Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity. The Authority's Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity shall approve all prior substitutions, in writing, in order to ensure that the substitutions of firms are bona fide DBEs.

- c. In the event of the Contractor's non-compliance with the disadvantaged business requirements of the contract, the Authority shall impose such contract sanctions as it or the Federal Transit Administration may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
  - (i) Withholding of payments to the Contractor until the Contractor complies, and/or
  - (ii) Cancellation, termination or suspension of the contract, in whole or in part.
7. For the information of Contractors, Exhibit F outlines the Authority's rules, guidelines and criteria for (a) making determinations as to the legitimacy of DBEs (b) ensuring that contracts are awarded to Contractors that meet DBE goals, and (c) counting DBE participation toward DBE goals.
8. The Contractor shall cooperate with the Authority's Executive Director, Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity or a designee in any reviews of the Contractor's procedures and practices with respect to disadvantaged business enterprises which the Executive Director, Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity may from time to time conduct.

## **B. DBE Reporting and Recordkeeping Requirements.**

1. The Contractor shall submit periodic reports (i.e. dependent upon the duration of the contract) of contracting with disadvantaged business enterprises in such form and manner and at such time as prescribed by the Authority (Exhibit C-1 is currently required to be submitted within 10 calendar days following the end of each calendar quarter) for contracts with 12 months duration. If the contract duration is for less than 12 months period, reports must be submitted within 10 calendar days following the end of each month. Any failure to submit this report within 10 days of the end of a month or quarter, as specified by MARTA, could potentially cause a delay in future progress payments.
3. The Contractor and Subcontractors shall permit access to their books, records, and accounts by the Federal DOT or the Federal Transit Administration and the Authority's Executive Director, Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity, or a designated representative, for purpose of investigation to ascertain compliance with these specified requirements. Such records shall be maintained by the Contractor in a fashion, which is readily accessible to the Authority for a minimum of three years following completion of the contract.
4. To ensure that all obligations under any contract awarded as a result of this proposal solicitation are met, the Authority will conduct periodic reviews of the Contractor's DBE involvement efforts during contract performance. The Contractor shall bring to the attention of the Authority's Office of Diversity



and Equal Opportunity any situation in which regularly scheduled progress payments are not promptly made to DBE Subcontractors. Prompt payments to disadvantaged businesses are a requirement of 49 CFR Part 26 and are subject to interest charges, when not made within five (5) days of the Authority paying the Prime Contractor.

### C. Miscellaneous Requirements.

1. There should be no restrictions through, for example, law provisions, partnership agreements, or charter requirements for cumulative voting rights or otherwise that prevent the minority or women owners, without the cooperation or vote of any owner who is not a minority or woman, from making a business decision of the firm in accordance with 49 CFR 26.27(c).
2. The Contractor shall take affirmative steps in establishing local banking requirements for funds received from this project. Failure to investigate the opportunities to use banking institutions owned and controlled by minorities and women in good faith may cause a Contractor to be in non-compliance with 49 CFR 26.27. The Federal requirement states that deposits in banking institutions are not to be considered toward fulfillment of the DBE goals.
3. **Subcontractor Agreements.** After Contract Award, the Contractor will be required to submit copies of signed subcontract agreements with all subcontractors and sub recipients they will use to the Executive Director of Diversity and Equal Opportunity for review and approval. All subcontract agreements shall denote the Contract Assurance clause 49 CFR Part 26.13; the name of the person authorized to sign for the Subcontractor; the date on which the subcontract agreement was signed; the names of witnesses required; the Scope of Work and compensation for services rendered; and the beginning and ending date for the tasks assigned to the subcontractors. The Authority will not allow any subcontractor or sub recipient to perform any work under the Contract unless its subcontract agreement(s) has been received at least ten days prior to commencement of the subcontractor's and sub recipient's work. The subcontractor and sub recipient agreement shall contain language governing how the subcontractor will be paid that mirrors how MARTA will pay the prime in those instances where work is delayed because of terroristic, color coded alerts issued by Federal Homeland Security.
4. **Prompt Payment and Retention. Prompt Payment and Retention for Subcontractors.** It is the policy of the Authority that prompt payment is made to all subcontractors. **Each subcontract the prime contractor signs with a subcontractor must include the following assurance:** The Contractor is required to pay subcontractors for satisfactory performance of their contracts within 5 days after the Authority has paid the Contractor for such work. The Contractor will not be paid for work performed by a subcontractor until the prime ensures that the subcontractor is paid. The Contractor shall not require retainage of subcontractors that is greater than the retainage required of the Contractor by the Authority. In addition, the Contractor must return any retainage payments to those subcontractors within 14 days after the subcontractor's work related to this contract is satisfactorily completed; or any retainage payments after incremental acceptance of the subcontractor's work by MARTA and Contractor's receipt of the partial retainage payment related to the subcontractor's work.



The Contractor's failure to pay subcontractors, as provided herein, shall be a material breach for which the Authority may cancel the Contract. In addition, 49 CFR 26.29 cites that all progress payments not promptly processed by the prime within specified time limits (i.e. 5 days from receipt of payment by MARTA) will bear interest of 1% per month on the unpaid balance. The Contractor shall not delay or postpone payment to a subcontractor without prior written approval from the Executive Director of Diversity and Equal Opportunity.

5. **Prompt Payment and Retention for Lower Tier Contractors.** It is the policy of the Authority that prompt payment is made to all lower tier contractors. **Each lower tier contract the subcontractor signs with a lower tier contractor must include the following assurance:** The Subcontractor is required to pay the lower tier contractors for satisfactory performance of their contracts within 5 days after the Prime has paid the Subcontractor for such work. The Contractor will not be paid for work performed by the lower tier contractor until the subcontractor ensures that the lower tier contractor is paid. The subcontractor shall not require retainage of the lower tier contractors that is greater than the retainage required of the Contractor by the Authority. In addition, the Contractor must return any retainage payments to the lower tier contractors within 14 days after the lower tier contractor's work related to this contract is satisfactorily completed; or any retainage payments after incremental acceptance of the lower tier contractor's work by the Prime and subcontractor's receipt of the partial retainage payment related to the lower tier contractor's work.

The subcontractor's failure to pay the lower tier contractor, as provided herein, shall be a material breach for which the Prime may cancel the Subcontract. In addition, 49 CFR 26.29 cites that all progress payments not promptly processed by the prime within specified time limits (i.e. 5 days from receipt of payment by MARTA) will bear interest of 1% per month on the unpaid balance. The Subcontractor shall not delay or postpone payment to the lower tier contractor without prior written approval from the Executive Director of Diversity and Equal Opportunity.

6. **Arbitration.** The Contractor is required to include, in each subcontract, a clause requiring the use of appropriate arbitration mechanisms to resolve all payment disputes. The Contractor must promptly notify The Authority when a DBE subcontractor performing work related to this contract is terminated or fails to complete its work, and must make good faith efforts to engage another DBE subcontractor to perform at least the same amount of work. Before transmitting to MARTA its request to terminate, the prime contractor must give notice in writing to the DBE of its intent to do so. A copy of this notice must be provided to MARTA prior to consideration of the request to terminate. The DBE will then have five (5) days to respond and advise MARTA of why it objects to the proposed termination **(the five day period may be reduced if the matter is one of public necessity, e.g., safety)**. The Contractor may not terminate any DBE subcontractor and perform that work through its own forces or those of an affiliate without prior written consent of the Executive Director of Diversity and Equal Opportunity.
7. Upon receipt of the Administrative Notice to Proceed and prior to Site Notice to Proceed, the contractor must submit a schedule of work indicating scope of

work for each subcontractor and the time frame in which it is anticipated that this work will be performed.

8. The Contractor must provide MARTA's Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity with the name and contact information for the EEO officer who will be responsible for all matters pertaining to Affirmative Action and DBE participation for the duration of the contract. During the term of the contract, the contractor's EEO officer will be responsible for the completion and submission of all quarterly reports to MARTA's Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity. In addition, the EEO officer will also be responsible for serving as the Contractor's liaison for all matters pertaining to DBE firms participating on the contract, including but not limited to, payment and performance issues, substitutions, etc.
9. **Contract Compliance.** The Contractor shall comply with all Davis Bacon, Affirmative Action, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO), and Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) laws, Executive Orders, and regulations. The Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity shall provide technical assistance to contractors on their compliance obligations; identify instances of non-compliance, and the implementation of timely and effective remedies to address non-compliance.
10. The contractor shall establish and maintain policies that provide opportunities for the full utilization and skill-improvement opportunities to assure the increased participation of minority groups and disadvantaged persons and women on their projects.
11. The contractor shall fully comply with Federal laws, directives, executive orders and implemented regulations for the duration of this contract. The Contractor shall display, on a bulletin board in the job site trailer in an accessible and visible location, posters that provide Federal information pertaining to safety (OSHA), wage and hour (Davis Bacon), Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO), and Americans with Disability Act (ADA).
12. The contractor shall provide the Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity their full cooperation and support during the Equal Opportunity Compliance Reviews of their company.

#### **D. Civil Rights Requirements**

The Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable civil rights statutes and implementing regulations including, but not limited to, the following:

1. Nondiscrimination in Federal Transit Programs. The Contractor agrees to comply, and assure the compliance of each subcontractor at any tier of the Project, with the provisions of 49 USC § 5332, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, or age, and prohibits discrimination in employment or business opportunity.
2. Nondiscrimination – Title VI of the Civil Rights Act. The Contractor agrees to comply, and assure the compliance of each subcontractor at any tier of the Project, with all requirements prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as

amended, 42 U.S.C. § 2000d *et seq.*, and US DOT regulations, "Nondiscrimination in Federally-Assisted Programs of the Department of Transportation – Effectuation of title VI of the Civil rights Act," 49 CFR Part 21, and any implementing requirements FTA may issue.

3. Equal Employment Opportunity. The Contractor agrees to comply, and assure the compliance of each subcontractor at any tier of the Project, with all requirements of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, 42 USC 42 U.S.C. § 2000e, and 49 USC 42 U.S.C. § 5332 and any implementing requirements FTA may issue. The contractor agrees that it will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, creed, sex, disability, age, or national origin. Affirmation action will be taken to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, creed, sex, disability, age, or national origin. The Contractor also agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue. Failure by the Contractor to carry out the terms of the EEO program will be treated as a violation of the Contract or Agreement.
4. Disadvantaged Business Enterprise. The Contractor agrees to comply with section 1101 (b) of TEA-21, 23 USC 42 USC § 101 note, and US DOT regulations, "Participation by Disadvantaged Business Enterprises in Department of Transportation Financial Assistance Programs," 49 CFR Part 23. The Contractor agrees that it shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the award and performance of any subcontract supported with Federal assistance derived from the US DOT or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR Part 26. The Contractor agrees to take all necessary and reasonable steps set forth in 49 CFR Part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of all subcontracts supported with Federal assistance derived from the USDOT. The Authority's DBE program, as required 49 CFR Part 26 and approved by the USDOT, is incorporated by reference and made part of the Contractual Agreement.
5. Discrimination on the Basis of Sex. The Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable requirements of Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended, 20 USC 42 USC §§ 1681 *et seq.*, with implementing USDOT regulations, "Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Sex in Education Programs or activities receiving Federal Financial Assistance," 49 CFR Part 25, and with any implementing directives that US DOT or FTA may promulgate, which prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex.
6. Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Age. The Department shall be established and it shall make factual findings and set goals as soon as practicable after favorable vote at the referenda and in any case before MARTA lets contracts for construction of its rapid transit system. The goals as they relate to those job categories which are enumerated in the Atlanta Plan of the Department of Labor shall in no case be less than the numbers specified in said Atlanta Plan. As to the other job categories, goals must be targets reasonably attainable by means of applying every good faith effort to make all aspects of the entire program work effectively; and

In any situation of under-utilization of minority manpower, MARTA and its contractors and their subcontractors shall undertake affirmative action programs, within contemplation of Executive Order 11246, including the provision of training to minority workers, to achieve and maintain the objectives of this policy.

This policy statement shall be distributed, both internally and externally, and shall be made a part of all of the Authority's invitations to bid.

## **DETERMINATIONS REGARDING DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE GOALS**

It is the policy of the Authority and the Federal Government to ensure that DBEs have a full opportunity for meaningful participation in work performed under Authority contracts. The Authority views meaningful disadvantaged business enterprise participation as being something more than mere tokenism or feigned DBE involvement and looks to the substance of proposed commitments in terms of the legitimacy of the disadvantaged business enterprise and its actual involvement in performance of the contract work. Thus, meaningful disadvantaged business enterprise participation needs to be defined, understood, and evaluated to determine if the proposed disadvantaged business enterprise involvement will provide opportunities to increase the experience and expertise of the DBE as well as to enhance its potential to achieve economic viability.

### **Determination of DBE Status**

To ensure that the Authority's DBE Program benefits only DBEs which are owned and controlled in both form and substance by one or more disadvantaged persons or women, the Authority requires that each business including the DBE partner in a joint venture, wishing to participate as a joint venture DBE complete and submit Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Business Disclosure Requirements (Exhibit D). Additionally each entity wishing to participate as a joint venture DBE must complete and submit Joint Venture Disclosure Requirements (Exhibit E). The Disclosure Requirements are to be signed and notarized by the authorized representatives of the business entity and are to be submitted through the Bidder to the Authority prior to contract award. Under the following circumstances, a business seeking to participate as a DBE need not to submit Exhibits D and E.

1. If the potential DBE contractor states in writing that it has submitted the same information to or has been certified by the Authority, any U.S. Department of Transportation element, or another Federal Agency that uses essentially the same disadvantaged business enterprise definition and ownership and control criteria as U.S. D.O.T. The potential DBE contractor is to obtain the information and certification (if any) from the other agency and submit to the Authority or cause the other agency to submit it. The Authority may rely upon such a certification, but the authority reserves the right to require that additional information be submitted and to make an independent determination. Where another agency has collected information but not made a determination concerning eligibility, the Authority will make its own determination based on the information it has obtained from the other agency.



(d) A UCP is not required to process an application for certification from a firm having its principal place of business outside the state if the firm is not certified by the UCP in the state in which it maintains its principal place of business. The "home state" UCP shall share its information and documents concerning the firm with other UCPs that are considering the firm's application.

2. If the potential DBE contractor has been determined by the Small Business Administration to be owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals under Section 8 (a) of the Small Business Act, as amended. In this circumstance, the potential DBE contractor is to furnish conclusive evidence of the SBA determination to the Authority.

The Authority reserves the right to request and review additional relevant information pertaining to the legitimacy of any purported DBE.

## DBE Eligibility Standards

In general, to be eligible for the DBE program, persons must own 51% or more of a "small business," establish that they are disadvantaged within the meaning of DOT regulations, and prove they control their business. The following general guidelines, taken in part from the applicable regulation (49 CFR Part 26), will help business owners determine whether they are eligible for the DBE program:

Eligibility Guidelines (in general):

1. **Ownership** - Your business must be 51% owned by a socially and economically *disadvantaged* individual(s).
2. **"Disadvantaged"** - You may be eligible if you are a member of a group of persons the Department considers as disadvantaged. The Department presumes certain groups are disadvantaged, including women, Black Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, Asian-Pacific Americans, Subcontinent Asian-Pacific Americans, or other minorities found to be disadvantaged by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA). Persons who are not members of one of the above groups and own and control their business may also be eligible if they establish their "social" and "economic" disadvantage. The Department notes, for example, that people with disabilities have disproportionately low incomes and high rates of unemployment, and that many may be socially and economically disadvantaged. A determination of whether an individual with a disability meets DBE eligibility criteria is made on a case-by-case basis. More information on how social and economic disadvantage is determined can be found in Appendix E to 49 CFR Part 26.

3. **Business Size Determination** - A firm (including its affiliates) must be a small business as defined by SBA standards. It must not have annual gross receipts over \$22,410,000 in the previous three fiscal years (\$52,470,000 for airport concessionaires in general with some exceptions). Under SAFETEA-LU, this threshold will be adjusted annually for inflation by the Secretary.
4. **Personal Net Worth** - Only disadvantaged persons having a personal net worth (PNW) of less than \$1,320,000 can be considered as a potential qualified DBE. Items excluded from a person's net worth calculation include an individual's ownership interest in the applicant firm, and his or her equity in their primary residence. Additional exclusions are available for owners of airport concessionaires (See 49 CFR Part 23).
5. **Independence** - The business must not be tied to another firm in such a way as to compromise its independence and control.
6. **Control** - A disadvantaged owner seeking certification must possess the power to direct or cause the direction of the management and policies of the firm. The owner must also have an overall understanding of, and managerial and technical competence and experience directly related to, the type of business in which the firm is engaged.
7. **Burden of Proof Allocation** - Applicants carry the initial burden of proof regarding their eligibility and must demonstrate that they meet all requirements concerning group membership or individual disadvantage, business size, ownership, and control.

Additional program requirements and certification procedures are found in the Department's regulations 49 CFR Parts 23 and 26. Specific information can also be found within the Department of Transportation's Office of Small and Disadvantaged Business Utilization. In addition to the foregoing standards, the Authority gives special consideration to the following circumstances in determining DBE eligibility.

1. Newly formed firms and firms whose ownership and/or control have changed since the date of the advertisement of the contract are closely scrutinized to determine the reasons for the timing of the formation of or change in the firm.
2. A previous and/or continuing employer-employee relationship between or among present owners are carefully reviewed to ensure that the employee-owner has management responsibilities and capabilities discussed herein.
3. Any relationship between a DBE and a business which is not a DBE which has an interest in the DBE is carefully reviewed to determine if the interest of the non-DBE conflicts with the ownership and control requirements of the DBE definition and guidelines.

Once approved by the Georgia Uniform Certification Program (GUCP) as a DBE, each DBE is expected to update its submission annually by submitting, Exhibit D and/or E, as appropriate, certifying that Exhibit D and/or E on file is still accurate. At any time there is a change in ownership or control of the firm, the DBE is to submit a new Exhibit D and/or E, at the time of such occurrences.

The denial of DBE status to an entity by the U.S. D.O.T. or the GUCP is to be considered final, for the contract and other contracts being led by the Authority at the time of denial of DBE certification, except that any firm which believes that it has been wrongly denied certification as a DBE may file an appeal with the U.S. Department of Transportation pursuant to 49 CFR 26.89. DBEs and joint ventures denied certification may correct deficiencies in their ownership and control and apply for DBE status one year from the date of denial.

## **Counting DBE Participation Toward DBE Goals**

DBE participation is counted toward meeting DBE goals as follows:

1. Once a firm is determined to be an eligible DBE, the total dollar value of the contract awarded to the DBE is counted toward the applicable DBE goal. If a DBE is found to be ineligible after contract award, the prime contractor is not relieved of the DBE requirement. When a prime contractor has made a commitment to using the ineligible firm, or you have made a commitment to using a DBE prime contractor, but a subcontract or contract has not been executed before you issue the decertification notice provided for in paragraph (g) of this section, the ineligible firm does not count toward the contract goal or overall goal. You must direct the prime contractor to meet the contract goal with an eligible DBE firm or demonstrate to you that it has made a good faith effort to do so. The contractor may substitute or provide good faith efforts as stated in 49 CFR Part 26.87 i (1).
2. The total dollar value of a contract to a DBE owned and controlled by both disadvantaged males and non-minority females is counted toward the goals for disadvantaged and women, respectively, in proportion to the percentage of ownership and control of each group in the business. The total dollar value of a contract with a DBE owned and controlled by disadvantaged women is counted toward either the disadvantaged goal or the goal for women, but not for both. The contractor employing the firm may chose the goal to which the contract value is applied.
3. When a DBE subcontracts part of the work of its contract to another firm, the value of the subcontracted work may be counted toward DBE goals only if the DBE's subcontractor is itself a DBE. Work that a DBE subcontracts to a non-DBE firm does not count toward DBE goals.

4. A contractor may count toward the DBE goals a portion of the total dollar value of contract with a joint venture equal to the percentage of the ownership and control of the DBE partner in the joint venture.
5. A contractor may count toward the DBE goals only expenditures to DBEs that perform a commercially useful function in the work of a contract. A DBE is considered to perform a commercially useful function when it is responsible for execution of a distinct element of the work of a contract and carrying out its responsibilities by actually performing, managing, and supervising the work involved. To determine whether a DBE is performing a commercially useful function, the Authority will evaluate the amount of work subcontracted, industry practices and other relevant factors.
6. Consistent with normal industry practices a DBE may enter in subcontracts. If a DBE contractor subcontracts a significantly greater portion of the work of the contract than would be expected on the basis of normal industry practices, the DBE shall be presumed not to be performing a commercially useful function. The DBE may present evidence to rebut this presumption to the Authority. The Authority's decision on the rebuttal of this presumption is subject to review by the U.S. Department of Transportation.
7. A DBE trucking company is performing a commercially useful function: The DBE may also lease trucks from a non-DBE firm, including an owner-operator. The DBE who leases trucks from a non-DBE is entitled to credit only for the fee or commission it receives as a result of the lease arrangement. The DBE does not receive credit for the total value of the transportation services provided by the lessee, since these services are not provided by a DBE.
8. A contractor may count toward its DBE goal expenditures for materials and supplies obtain from DBE suppliers and manufactures, provided that the DBEs assume the actual contractual responsibility for the provision of the materials and supplies. The contractor may count its entire expenditure to a DBE manufacture (i.e., a supplier that produces goods from raw materials or substantially alters them before resale). The contractor may count 60 percent of its expenditures to DBE suppliers that are not manufactures, provided that the DBE supplier performs a commercially useful function in the supply process. No percentage amount will be authorized by the Authority to be counted if DBE suppliers do not perform a commercially useful function and are a totally passive conduit.

## Examples of DBE Participation

The degree of DBE goal attainment through utilization of DBEs and disadvantaged-majority joint ventures will be calculated as in the following examples.

A joint venture consisting of a disadvantaged business and a majority business, functioning as a prime contractor, will be credited with disadvantaged participation on the basis of percentage of profit to accrue to the DBE. For example, if a joint venture composed of a disadvantaged business and a majority business proposes to perform 50 percent of a project quoted at \$500,000 and 50 percent of the profits are to accrue to disadvantaged partner in the joint venture, disadvantaged participation will be credited as 25 percent of the work, or 125,000.

A DBE distributor or supplier, which performs a commercially useful function, will be credited with 60 percent of the total dollar value of an order toward the DBE goal. For example, A DBE supplier which plays a substantial role in the delivery arrangements and which actually possesses risk of liability for defective products or late delivery may credit \$ 300,000 or 60 percent of a total supply order of \$500,000.

No meaningful DBE goal is achievable unless great care is taken to ensure that contracts let pursuant to the goal requirements are let only to bona fide DBEs. MARTA bidders and contractors are expected to exercise the greatest possible care that disadvantaged firms with whom joint ventures are formed and subcontracts are let and bon fide.

This information must be in the form of an affidavit and submitted by the prime contractor. A bidder/proponent must show reasonable good faith efforts to obtain DBE participation. MARTA treats bidder's/proponent's compliance with good faith efforts requirements as a matter of responsiveness. Such reasonable efforts may include, but are not limited to, some or all of the following:

- Efforts to provide DBE's with adequate information about the plans, specifications, and requirements of the contract in a timely manner to assist them in responding to a solicitation;
- Efforts made to select portions of the work (including, where appropriate, breaking down the contract into economically feasible units) proposed to be performed by DBE's in order to increase the likelihood of achieving the DBE goal;
- Efforts to negotiate with DBE's for specific sub-bids, including at a minimum;
- The names, addresses, and telephone numbers of DBE's that were contacted;
- A description of the information provided to DBE's regarding the plans and specifications for portions of the work to be performed and;
- A detailed statement of the reasons why additional prospective agreements with DBE's needed to meet the stated goals, were not reached.

#### **1. SERVICES.**

- (a) Service. Subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein, Consultant shall perform the services described in the statement of work attached hereto as **Exhibit A** ("Statement of Work," "Scope of Work," "Scope of Services," "Work" or "Services"). The Consultant acknowledges and agrees that this Contract is non-exclusive and the Services to be performed hereunder may be performed on a non-exclusive basis in MARTA's sole discretion. The Consultant shall perform the Services when ordered from time to time by MARTA or as stipulated in the Statement of Work. Consultant will be responsible for the cost of, obtaining, maintaining and complying with, and paying all fees and taxes associated with, all applicable licenses, authorizations, consents, approvals and permits required of Consultant in performing Services and complying with this Contract.
- (i) Work. All of the Consultant's work shall be as authorized by MARTA under work orders, each of which shall have a discrete and separate scope of work, schedule and time of performance and compensation limit ("Work Order(s)"). Each Work Order shall become a part of this Contract and be affixed thereto once the parties have agreed to the Work Order and its terms in writing on the Work Order. Work Orders may be amended from time to time in accordance with the terms of this Contract. Consultant acknowledges and agrees that MARTA will issue Work Orders in compliance with the terms of this Contract and the Work Order Procedures [attached hereto as **Exhibit C**.]
- (ii) Changes to the Work. MARTA may, at any time by providing written notice to Consultant, issue additional instructions, require additional work or services, or direct the omission (or temporary or permanent suspension) of any Work, Work Order or services covered by (or requested pursuant to) this Contract. If such changes cause a material increase or decrease in the amount or character of the (A) Work to be done under this Contract, (B) schedule for performance or (C) amount of compensation to be paid the Consultant shall be reasonably adjusted commensurate with the increase or decrease in the cost to perform the Work resulting from such changes (including, reasonably indirect costs and profit directly associated with the change). Such adjustments shall be determined by negotiation, if possible, on the

foregoing basis, and the Contract shall be modified in writing accordingly. Any claim for adjustment under this Section must be asserted in writing within thirty (30) days from the date of delivery of the notification of the change, unless MARTA (in its sole discretion) in writing grants a longer period of time. In no event shall any claim be made after the date of final payment under the Contract. Nothing provided in this Section shall excuse the Consultant from proceeding with the prosecution of the Work so changed; provided, however, that no adjustment shall be made, in either the fee for work to be paid for on the basis of Cost-Plus-Fee, or in the Lump Sum for work to be paid for on this basis, because of any error, omission, or combination thereof in the computations or negotiations on which such Fee or such Lump Sum is based, or because the actual costs of performing the Work required by the Contract as entered varies from that assumed or computed in arriving at such Fee or Lump Sum.

- (iii) Additional Work. From time to time the Authority may require work not previously anticipated, as occasioned by emergencies occurring in the operation of the bus or rail system, or other events. Such additional work shall be assigned to the Consultant by Work Order (“Additional Work”) which shall specify the nature of the Additional Work, the schedule for the completion of the Additional Work and the method and amount of compensation for the Additional Work contemplated. The Consultant shall perform such Additional Work in accordance with the Work Order, in the same manner and with the same degree of skill and care as work assigned to the Consultant under Work Orders assigned under Section A. In the event of an emergency affecting public health, public safety or the continued operation of revenue service, the Consultant may be directed verbally by the Authority’s Management Representative or Technical Representative to proceed with Additional Work necessary to address such emergency, and a written Work Order will be issued as expeditiously as possible after the Additional Work has commenced.
- (iv) Subcontracts. The Consultant may retain sub-consultants in furtherance of the services required in a specific Work Order. Consultant agrees that it must receive MARTA’s written approval prior to retaining any sub-consultants to perform any of the Work or services set forth in any Work Order. Consultant acknowledges and agrees that any contracts between Consultant and a sub-consultant shall include all of the terms and conditions imposed on the Consultant by this Contract (and any specific Work Order[s]).
- (v) Arrangement not Exclusive. The Consultant acknowledges and understands that the Authority may employ other Consultants and/or consultants to perform the same or similar work, as determined in the Authority’s sole discretion.
- (vi) Inspection of the Work. MARTA shall have the right, but not the duty, to inspect, at any reasonable time (and from time to time) during performance or after completion, each and any phase of field or office work. MARTA will make such periodic inspections as it may deem necessary or desirable, and may issue such special instructions to the Consultant as it may deem necessary in order to ensure satisfactory progress as required by the Contract, and compliance with other terms and conditions of the Contract; provided, however, that MARTA shall not supervise or control the Consultant's officers, servants, agents, or employees who are engaged in performance of the work under the Contract, and shall not be responsible for such supervision or control. This provision does not modify, in any way, responsibilities pursuant to the indemnity provisions of this Contract.

- (b) Consultant Costs. Unless otherwise expressly provided in this Contract (or a specific Work Order), all materials, equipment, software, facilities and labor required for the proper performance of the Services shall be furnished by and be under the sole direction and control of Consultant and at Consultant's sole expense. Consultant shall be responsible, at its sole cost, for procuring and using such resources in a professional and manner at no additional cost to MARTA.
- (c) Removal of Employees Assigned to MARTA Contract. Within a reasonable period, but not later than seven (7) days after Consultant's receipt of notice from MARTA that the continued assignment to this Contract of any Consultant Employees is not in the best interests of MARTA or may create a conflict of interest (in MARTA's sole determination), Consultant shall remove such Consultant Employee(s) from providing services under this Contract. Consultant will not be required to terminate the employment of such individual. Consultant will assume all costs associated with the replacement of any Consultant Employees. In addition, Consultant agrees to remove from this Contract any Consultant Employees who have engaged in willful misconduct or have committed a material breach of this Contract immediately after Consultant becomes aware of such misconduct or breach and notify MARTA of the same. For purposes of this Contract, the term "Consultant Employee(s)" shall mean all of Consultant's employees, consultants, sub-consultants, agents, including, without limitation, the employees, Consultants, sub-consultants, agents of Consultant's partners or joint venture partners and any other individuals or entities providing any of the Services set forth in the Contract under the color of Consultant's authority.
- (d) Representatives of the Parties.
- (i) Consultant Authorized Representative. Consultant designates the person(s) named herein above as its Consultant Authorized Representative ("Consultant Authorized Representative") who shall: (a) be an employee within Consultant's organization, with the information, authority and resources available to properly coordinate Consultant's responsibilities under this Contract; (b) serve as primary interface and the single-point of communication for the provision of Services by Consultant; (c) have day-to-day responsibility and authority to address issues relating to the Services; and (d) devote adequate time and efforts to managing and coordinating the Services.
- (ii) MARTA Authorized Representative. MARTA designates the person(s) named herein above as its MARTA Authorized Representative(s) ("MARTA Authorized Representative") who shall: (a) serve as primary interface and the primary point(s) of communication for the provision of Services; (b) have day-to-day responsibility to address issues relating to this Contract; and (c) to the extent provided under applicable law (and the policies and procedures of MARTA) as the same may change from time to time, have the authority to execute any additional documents or changes on behalf of MARTA
- (iii) Technical Representative. MARTA and the Consultant shall each designate a Technical Representative to provide for the orderly and timely execution of the work pursuant to this Contract. Assessment of the quantity and quality of Services provided, adjustment of daily work schedules, technical direction, technical interpretation, resolution of technical questions, and other technical activities and correspondence shall be made by and between the Technical Representatives. Any assessment, adjustment, direction, interpretation, correspondence, or

other activity made by and between the Technical Representatives shall be in compliance with the provisions of this Contract.

MARTA and the Consultant shall each notify the other party in writing of the persons designated as the Consultant Authorized Representative, MARTA Authorized Representative, and/or Technical Representative shall change during the term of this Contract, and such designations shall remain in effect until a written Notice of Revocation is given to the other party.

2. **TERM.** The term of this Contract shall commence on the Effective Date and expire **three (3) years** thereafter.
3. **OPTIONS.** The parties hereto acknowledge and agree that MARTA has **two (2) options** to extend the Term of this Contract for **one (1) year each** (each individually is referred to herein as an "Option" and collectively referred to herein as the "Options"). MARTA may exercise its Option by giving Contract written notice thereof at least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the then existing Term.
4. **NOTICE TO PROCEED.** The Consultant shall not commence the Work until all of the following conditions have been fulfilled: (a) MARTA has approved the Consultant's Affirmative Action Program submitted in accordance with this Contract; (b) the Consultant has delivered to MARTA all Certificates of Insurance required by this Contract; and (c) the Consultant has received a written Notice to Proceed from MARTA's Authorized Representative. The term 'Notice to Proceed' for purposes of this Contract shall mean a written instruction from MARTA to Consultant instructing the Consultant to commence work under this Contract and shall form a part of this Contract and be attached hereto at **Exhibit C** until such time as it is superseded by a fully executed Work Order. The initial Notice to Proceed will state the work element or elements on which the Consultant is authorized to begin providing Services, if any. The performance of Work (or elements thereof) not included in the initial/limited Notice to Proceed shall be commenced only upon receipt of a Work Order authorizing the Consultant to proceed with work under said Work Order. The Consultant shall not be entitled to compensation for any Work (or elements thereof) performed or costs incurred with respect to any Work (or elements thereof) before Consultant receives a properly authorized and approved (a) Notice to Proceed or (b) Work Order. Each Work Order issued pursuant to the Contract will stipulate the time for completion of the Scope of Work for that specific Work Order; this time will begin upon and be measured from the Consultant's receipt of the Notice to Proceed with such Work Order.
5. **SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS.** Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the Parties acknowledge and agree that in the event of a conflict between the terms and conditions contained in **Exhibit B** and the balance of the Contract, the terms and conditions set forth in **Exhibit B** shall control.
6. **TIME OF PERFORMANCE.**
  - (a) **General.** Timely performance of all work assigned hereunder is a material term of this Contract. All of the Services shall be accomplished by the Consultant as part of specific written Work Orders. The work of the Consultant under each Work Order shall commence and be completed within the time of performance specified in each Work Order except that, in the event of authorized delays, the specified time of performance shall be extended by the aggregate of all such authorized delays.

- (b) Authorized Delays. A delay in the progress of the work will be considered authorized provided that it is an excusable delay (as defined below) and approved in writing by MARTA. Approval shall neither cover a period longer than that properly attributable to the stated reason nor extend beyond any notice from MARTA to resume work.
- (c) Excusable Delays. A delay in the progress of the work will be considered to be excusable only when: (1) it is the result of a Force Majeure event and the Consultant notified MARTA within forty-eight (48) hours of the start of such delay and confirms the same in writing (within five (5) business days) articulating the reason thereof and requesting an extension of time; or (2) the Consultant receives written notice from MARTA directing it to delay progress of all or any part of the Services.
- (d) Resumption of Work. The Consultant shall make every effort to resume the work following authorized delays within one (1) business day following cessation of conditions causing the delay or notice from MARTA to resume the work.

## 7. COMPENSATION.

- (a) MARTA shall pay Consultant for the Services actually requested by MARTA pursuant to a fully executed Work Order (or in limited circumstances a properly authorized and executed Notice to Proceed), which are timely performed by Consultant in accordance with the terms of this Contract (including the terms of the specific Work Order/Notice to Proceed) by Consultant. Except as set forth herein or in a specific Work Order/Notice to Proceed, the Consultant may bill for the Services actually requested and rendered on a monthly basis. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, Consultant acknowledges and agrees not to submit an invoice to MARTA if the amount due is less than \$500.00, unless it is the final invoice. Each invoice must contain the following information (at a minimum) in order to be processed by MARTA: (A) Contract Number (and, if applicable, Work Order Number/Notice to Proceed); (B) contain a description of the Services rendered; and (C) be sent or delivered in duplicate to MARTA at 2424 Piedmont Rd., Atlanta, Georgia 30324-3330, **Attention: RFP P39820 MARTA's Planning Support and Technical Services**. Except as set forth in a specific Work Order/Notice to Proceed, MARTA will pay the undisputed portions of each invoice that is properly formatted, rendered and accepted by MARTA within forty-five (45) days after MARTA receives such invoice. Consultant agrees that it will pay sub-consultants for all work satisfactorily performed within five (5) working days from receipt of payment from MARTA. Consultant agrees that it will not receive final payment until the Parties have executed a Work Order.
- (b) Consultant shall perform the Services under this Contract pursuant to and in conformance with Work Orders (or in limited circumstances a properly authorized and executed Notice to Proceed) attached hereto as **Exhibit C**. Subject to Section 7(a) above, MARTA shall pay to the Consultant the compensation specified in the respective Work Order in accordance with Sections 7(b)(i), (ii) and (iii) below, as applicable and as determined for each Work Order issued hereunder.
  - (i) Lump Sum Compensation. MARTA shall pay to the Consultant the agreed upon sum for each Work Order issued hereunder on a Lump Sum basis. Such compensation will be paid in accordance with a schedule of payment pursuant thereto, if applicable, or based on the Consultant's estimate of the percentage of work completed, subject to MARTA's verification and concurrence.

(ii) Billing Rate Compensation. For each Work Order issued hereunder, MARTA shall pay to the Consultant an agreed upon hourly billing rate for each hour of work actually performed. MARTA and the Consultant shall agree upon an hourly billing rate for each labor category of personnel or for each individual employee engaged in the provision of services. MARTA shall pay these billing rates in lieu of actual wages and salaries and allowance for fringe benefits, overhead and profit. Project-specific expenses shall be reimbursed as defined in Section 7(c)(iii) below.

(iii) Cost-Plus Fixed Fee Compensation. Compensation paid on a Cost-Plus-Fixed-Fee basis shall consist of the Consultant's wages and salaries, indirect costs allowable under the Federal Acquisition Regulations, reasonable expenses, and a negotiated fee. Such fee will be negotiated on a Work Order by Work Order basis, based on the risk associated with the Work Order. Negotiated fees for this contract will not exceed ten percent (10%) of direct and indirect labor costs, as negotiated and agreed upon in each Work Order issued hereunder.

(c) Allowable Costs and Fee. The allowable costs and fees are to be derived as follows:

(i) Wages and Salaries. This item is the actual wages and salaries (as verified by certified payroll) paid to personnel of the Consultant while such personnel are engaged directly in the performance of services under this Contract and under an approved Work Order.

(ii) Indirect Costs. This item includes the fringe benefits paid or allocated to personnel whose wages and salaries are reimbursed as defined above, and reimbursement for the Consultant's overhead costs, which include general and administrative expenses incurred during the period of performance of Work Orders under this Contract, all as permitted and allowable under the provisions of the Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR).

Indirect Costs hereunder shall be compensated by applying a multiplier to the total amount of wages and salaries (excluding the premium portion of any overtime wages and salaries) charged to MARTA under this Contract. Said multiplier shall be negotiated and based on MARTA's audit of supporting documentation provided by the Consultant for a recently completed fiscal period. Pending determination of audit results and negotiation of the multiplier for the current fiscal year, the Consultant shall be reimbursed for such indirect costs at a provisional rate agreed upon by MARTA and the Consultant prior to execution of any work in the fiscal year. Upon receipt of audit results and negotiation of the multiplier for the current fiscal year, any billings paid based on the provisional multiplier shall be adjusted, as necessary, and reconciled as part of subsequent billings within the current fiscal year. The provisional multiplier shall be subject to downward adjustment only, as determined by the audited indirect cost rates. No upward adjustments shall be allowed.

(iii) Project-Specific Reimbursable Expenses. This item includes the actual and reasonable cost to the Consultant of work-related expenses, as defined in the applicable Work Order. In all categories of expenses, the Consultant is directed to minimize costs to every extent practicable, through the use of technology, efficient scheduling of the work, and similar cost saving measures. The Authority reserves the right to refuse to reimburse for expenses it determines to be unnecessary or excessive, or that could have been reduced or avoided through the use of technology or exercise of efficient planning. Reimbursement for work related travel shall be at

rates equivalent to or less than those rates published by the U. S. General Services Administration for government travel. The Consultant acknowledges that local personnel should be utilized whenever feasible.

(iv) Fee. For each Work Order issued under the Cost-Plus Fixed Fee compensation model described in Paragraph 6(b), in addition to the cost reimbursement provided for above, MARTA will pay to the Consultant a fee not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the Consultant's direct and indirect labor costs, to allow for the Consultant's profit for the performance of the work. Prior to commencement of the work, a maximum value for the Consultant's Fee shall be agreed upon based on the estimated totals for the Consultant's wages and salaries, and indirect costs. The maximum value for the Consultant's Fee shall be set forth in the Work Order, along with the Cost Limitation.

(d) Cost Limitation. Each Work Order issued under Billing Rate or Cost-Plus-Fixed Fee compensation shall have an associated Cost Limitation. Prior to commencement of the work, the Cost Limitation shall be computed based on the Consultant's estimated wages and salaries, indirect costs and work-related expenses.

The Consultant shall use its best efforts to perform the work of each Work Order within the associated Cost Limitation. If at any time the Consultant has reason to believe that the costs which it expects to incur in the performance of the work of a Work Order in the next succeeding thirty (30) calendar days, when added to all costs previously incurred against such Work Order, will exceed seventy-five percent (75%) of the Cost Limitation then set forth, or if at any time the Consultant has reason to believe that the cost to MARTA, exclusive of the Consultant's Fee for the performance of work under a given Work Order, will be greater or substantially less than the associated Cost Limitation, the Consultant shall notify MARTA in writing to that effect within seven (7) business days, giving the revised estimate of cost for the performance of work under the Work Order.

MARTA shall not be obligated to reimburse the Consultant for costs under a specific Work Order incurred in excess of the associated Cost Limitation, and the Consultant shall not be obligated to continue performance of work under the Work Order or to incur costs in excess of the Cost Limitation, unless and until MARTA has notified the Consultant in writing that such Cost Limitation has been increased and has specified in such notice a revised Cost Limitation pertaining to the Work Order. When the Cost Limitation is increased, any costs incurred by the Consultant in excess of the Cost Limitation prior to the increase shall be allowable to the same extent as if such costs had been incurred after the increase.

Any changes issued pursuant to Section 1(a)(ii) of this Contract shall not be considered an authorization to the Consultant to exceed the Cost Limitation set forth in this Contract or for any specific Work Order in the absence of a fully executed contract modification increasing the associated Cost Limitation.

(e) MARTA Imposed Limitation. MARTA will set a Compensation Limit on the costs (e.g., wages and salaries, indirect costs, work-related expenses and fees) that may be incurred in a given fiscal period and will notify the Consultant thereof. The Consultant shall not, without specific prior written authorization from MARTA, incur expenses or perform any services which would result in a total compensation that exceeds said limit unless such authorization has been given. The Consultant



agrees to promptly notify MARTA as soon as it has knowledge that the limit may be exceeded. Any resultant delay in the performance of the Work solely caused by the Consultant's attempt to avoid incurring expenses in excess of the limit shall be treated as an Authorized Delay.

- (f) Method of Payment. The parties recognize that at any time during the period of the Contract, the Consultant may be providing Services to MARTA under more than one active and approved Work Order. All Services of the Consultant shall be carefully accounted for and invoiced against the proper Work Order. Consolidated invoices shall be submitted no more often than monthly and shall allocate the costs between and among the various Work Orders, citing the respective Project, Task and Purchase Order Numbers. For Work Orders employing a Cost-Plus Fixed Fee arrangement, payment of the fee authorized by the Work Order shall be in proportion to the payment of direct and indirect costs.

Each invoice shall display the project charging details provided by MARTA for each Work Order. Each invoice submittal shall include a summary spreadsheet showing the total costs previously billed, currently billed, and billed-to-date, and the amounts remaining in the Cost Limitation, Fee or Lump Sum compensation, as applicable, for each Work Order. Invoices shall be supported by labor abstracts and other documentation supporting work-related expenses.

All costs associated with services performed during any monthly period shall be submitted for reimbursement before the end of the following two (2) monthly periods. MARTA shall not be obligated to reimburse the Consultant for costs submitted for reimbursement after the two (2) succeeding monthly periods have lapsed.

8. STANDARD OF CARE. The Consultant warrants that its professional services will be performed using that degree of required skill, care and diligence in the performance of the Services customarily exercised by other duly licensed engineers, architects, health and safety professionals and other licensed professionals performing comparable services under similar circumstances and according to its current description (including, without limitation, any completion criteria) contained in this Contract or the Work Orders issued hereunder. No review of any plans or specifications by or on behalf of MARTA shall to any degree relieve the Consultant from the responsibility to exercise the standard of care set forth herein or from any liability for any failure to meet the obligations set forth in this Contract.

- (a) Re-performance. In the event that any of the Services performed by the Consultant hereunder is deficient because of the Consultant's or a sub-consultant's failure to perform said Services in accordance with the standard of care set forth herein, MARTA shall report such deficiencies in writing to the Consultant. MARTA thereafter shall have:

- (i) The right to have the Consultant re-perform the Work at the Consultant's own expense and subject to the approval of MARTA; or
- (ii) The right to have the Work performed by others and the reasonable costs thereof charged to and collected from the Consultant if, within thirty (30) calendar days after written notice to the Consultant requiring such re-performance, the Consultant fails to give evidence satisfactory to MARTA that it has undertaken such re-performance in a manner satisfactory to MARTA.

- (b) Re-performed Services. If the Consultant is required to correct or re-perform any of the Services as provided herein, any Service or Work corrected or re-performed by the Consultant shall be subject to Final Acceptance to the same extent as the Service or Work was initially performed.
- (c) In the case of any failure by the Consultant to comply with the above standard of performance, such failure not having been satisfactorily corrected in accordance with this Contract, MARTA, in addition to all other remedies to which it may be entitled, at law, in equity or otherwise, shall recover from the Consultant all reasonable costs, expenses, and other damages, of any kind or nature whatsoever, arising directly or indirectly from such failure, including but not limited to the costs and expenses of redesign, and of all drawings, surveys, engineering tests, materials, and all incidental costs and expenses in connection therewith; all costs and expenses of reconstruction or alteration of any and all structures affected thereby, whether or not the subject of such failure; and all damages to or loss of any and all structures and other property, whether or not the subject of such failure, resulting directly or indirectly therefrom, to the extent such costs, expenses and other damages are caused by the Consultant's negligent acts, errors or omissions arising out of the performance of the Work.

9. **EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY AND DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES.**

- (a) The U.S. Department of Transportation ("U.S. DOT") regulations set forth in 49 C.F.R. Part 32, "Participation of Disadvantaged Business Enterprises in Department of Transportation Financial Assistance Programs," apply to this Contract (including, without limitation, any Work Orders issued pursuant hereto). Consultant agrees comply with the terms, conditions and goals set forth in **Appendix A**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and the following equal employment opportunity requirements:
  - (i) Nondiscrimination. In accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq., U.S. DOT regulations, "Nondiscrimination in Federally-Assisted Programs of the Department of Transportation – Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act," 49 C.F.R., Part 21, Section 303 of the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 6102, Section 202 of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. 12132, and Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. 5332, Consultant agrees that it will not discriminate against any business owner because of the owner's race, color, religion, national origin, sex or physical disability in connection with the award or performance of this Contract. Consultant agrees to include the above statements in any subcontracts or subsequent agreements that it enters into and cause those businesses to similarly include the statements in subsequent agreements related to this Contract. In addition, the Consultant agrees to comply with applicable Federal implementing regulations and other implementing requirements Federal Transit Administration ("FTA") may issue.
  - (ii) Race, Color, Creed, National Origin, Sex. In accordance with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 2000e, and Federal transit laws at 49 U.S.C. 5332, the Consultant agrees to comply with all applicable equal employment opportunity requirements of U.S. Department of Labor (U.S. DOL) regulations, "Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, Equal Employment Opportunity, Department of Labor," 41 C.F.R. Parts 60 et seq., (which implement Executive Order No. 11246, "Equal Employment Opportunity," as amended by Executive Order No. 11375, "Amending Executive Order 11246 Relating to Equal Employment Opportunity," 42 U.S.C. 2000e note), and with any applicable Federal statutes, executive orders, regulations,

and Federal policies that may in the future affect activities undertaken in the course of the Contract. The Consultant agrees to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, national origin, sex, or age. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. In addition, the Consultant agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.

(iii) Age. In accordance with Section 4 of the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967, as amended, 29 U.S.C. 621 through 634 and with implementing U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (U.S. EEOC) regulations, "Age Discrimination in Employment Act," 29 C.F.R. Part 1625 and Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. 5332, the Consultant agrees to refrain from discrimination against present and prospective employees for reason of age. In addition, the Consultant agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.

(iv) Disabilities. In accordance with Section 102 of the Americans with Disabilities Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 12112, the Consultant agrees that it will comply with the requirements of U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, "Regulations to Implement the Equal Employment Provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act," 29 C.F.R. Part 1630, pertaining to employment of persons with disabilities. In addition, the Consultant agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.

(b) Consultants are required to submit with their Equal Employment Opportunity ("EEO") statistical data, as well as, Disadvantaged Business Enterprise ("DBE") utilization commitments. This requirement pursuant to Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Executive Order 11246 as implemented by the Department of Labor's Office of Contract Compliance, Executive Order 11625, [Federal Transit Administration Circular 4716.1A, Federal Department of Transportation 49 CFR Part 23] and MARTA Board Policies on equal employment opportunity and DBE contracting goals.

(c) If Consultant has fifty (50) employees or more, Consultant is required to submit a copy of its affirmative action plan along with all other cited materials. The affirmative action plan shall contain, at a minimum, a utilization analysis, an analysis of any underutilization, a program of goals and timetables to correct any such underutilization, an auditing and record keeping process, internal and external EEO policy dissemination procedures and the identification and delineation of the affirmative action officer's responsibilities.

(d) If Consultant has less than fifty (50) employees, Consultant shall provide an equal opportunity policy statement signed by the firm's Chief Executive Officer (or its equivalent). The policy statement will indicate that the Consultant does not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex or national origin. Further, the Consultant will state that it will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during their employment, without regards to race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.

- (e) The Consultant also agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract financed in whole or in part with federal assistance provided by FTA, modified only if necessary to identify the affected parties.

10. **INTERNAL DISPUTE RESOLUTION.** In the event a dispute arises between the Consultant and MARTA in the performance of this Contract, the Technical Representatives shall strive to resolve the dispute internally. If the Technical Representatives cannot resolve the conflict within five (5) business days, the Consultant's Authorized Representative shall meet with the MARTA's Authorized Representative and shall expeditiously undertake, through direct, good faith negotiations, to resolve the dispute or controversy. If such efforts fail to resolve the issue, the MARTA's head of the Department of Contracts, Procurement & Materials (or his/her designee) and the Consultant's CEO/Principal shall meet and expeditiously undertake, through direct, good faith negotiations, to resolve the dispute or controversy. The nature of said controversy shall be documented in writing by the party initiating the negotiations. Any resolution shall be reduced to writing acknowledged by both parties and shall be memorialized as an amendment to an applicable Work Order or as an amendment to this Contract, where appropriate. Unless otherwise directed by MARTA, the Consultant and MARTA shall continue performance under this Contract while matters in dispute are being resolved. The parties acknowledge and agree that this Section shall not invalidate or preempt MARTA's rights under Section 10 of this Contract and MARTA may, in its sole discretion, pursue its rights and remedies under Section 11 of this Contract without seeking a remedy pursuant to this Section of the Contract.

11. **DEFAULT; REMEDIES.**

(a) Consultant shall be in default under the terms of this Contract if Consultant:

- (i) fails to make any payment within five (5) days of the date such payment is due to MARTA whether or not MARTA has provided Consultant with an invoice or written notice of the amount due or overdue;
- (ii) ceases to provide any of the Services without the written consent of MARTA's Authorized Representative or becomes permanently deprived of the rights, powers, or privileges necessary for the proper conduct thereof;
- (iii) becomes insolvent or seeks the benefit of any present or future insolvency statute, makes an assignment for the benefit of any creditor, files a voluntary petition in bankruptcy, or consents to the appointment of a receiver, trustee or liquidator of any of its assets;
- (iv) files a petition under any part of the federal bankruptcy laws, or an action under any present or future insolvency law or statute, or is involved in an involuntary bankruptcy filing that is not dismissed within sixty (60) days after filing
- (v) fails to keep, perform or observe any term, covenant or condition set forth in this Contract;
- (vi) intentionally or willfully misrepresents any material fact to MARTA;
- (vii) makes any material misrepresentation (or failed to make a full and accurate disclosure) to MARTA in the documents, questionnaires, forms or materials submitted by Consultant in response to the Request for Qualifications, Request for Expression of Interest and

Statement of Qualifications, Request for Proposals, Request for Quotes, Invitation to Bid, any other solicitation document or any document pursuant to which this Contract was awarded, or failed to comply with all requirements, including, without limitation, MARTA's ethical standards and conflicts of interest policies; or

(viii) fails to pay any and all taxes and assessments required to be paid under this Contract or in the operation of MARTA's business.

(b) If Consultant is in default, Consultant will notify MARTA in writing of the nature of the default and the time period within which to cure, if any. If Consultant, (a) where a specific time period for the cure is provided in the applicable subsection of this Contract, does not cure the default within that period, or (b) where a time period for the cure is not specifically provided in the applicable section, does not cure the default within twenty (20) days from receipt of notice from MARTA, MARTA may, without further notice to Consultant and Consultant's sureties, if any, elect to exercise any of the following remedies:

(i) terminate all or any portion of this Contract or any of Consultant's rights under this Contract at any time thereafter and recover from Consultant all costs, expenses, losses and damages recoverable under this Contract (including, without limitation, all reasonable costs associated with the re-procurement of the Services) or applicable law as a result thereof.

(ii) cure any default at Consultant's cost. If MARTA at any time, by reason of Consultant's default, pays any sum to cure any default, the sum paid by MARTA shall be immediately due from Consultant to MARTA, and shall bear interest at the rate of one and one-half percent (1.5%) per month from (or such maximum rate permissible by applicable law, if lower) the date paid by MARTA until the date MARTA is fully reimbursed by Consultant.

(iii) exercise any and all other rights or remedies available under this Contract or at law or in equity.

12. **TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE.** MARTA shall have the right to terminate this Contract without cause at any time during the term of this Contract by giving written notice to Consultant at least thirty (30) days prior to the date such termination is to be effective.

13. **EFFECT OF TERMINATION.** Unless otherwise provided herein, termination of this Contract, in whole or in part and for any reason, shall not affect: (a) any liabilities or obligations of either Party arising before such termination or out of the events causing such termination; or (b) any remedies to which a Party may be entitled under this Contract, at law or in equity. Upon termination of this Contract, Consultant shall immediately: (i) discontinue Services on the date and to the extent specified in the notice; (ii) inventory, maintain and turn over possession (and ownership) to MARTA of all finished and unfinished Work Product (hereinafter defined), studies, drawings, plans, maps, models, photographs, reports, licenses, equipment, materials, plant, tools, and property furnished by Consultant or provided by MARTA for performance of the terminated Services; (iii) comply with all other reasonable requests from MARTA regarding the terminated Services; and (iv) continue to perform in accordance with all of the terms and conditions of this Contract any portion of the Services that are not terminated. If the Contract is terminated by MARTA as provided herein, the Consultant will be paid, as full and sole compensation, the following amounts: (xx) for services or other work actually performed, completed satisfactorily, and accepted by MARTA, the actual and

reasonable cost thereof, plus mark-ups for general and administrative expenses, overhead, and fee computed in the same manner as those, if any, allowed in determining the Consultant's compensation if the Work had been completed; and (yy) all other costs directly, actually, and reasonably incurred to perform or to prepare to perform the Work not completed, but with no mark-ups thereon.

In that event, all finished and unfinished Work Product, documents, data, studies, surveys, drawings, maps, models, photographs, reports, and any other materials prepared by the Consultant as a part of the Services shall become the property of MARTA, and the Consultant shall be entitled to be paid as full and sole compensation, any amount that fairly represents the reasonable value to MARTA of any such part of the Services that has been completed in accordance with the requirements of the applicable Work Order and this Contract.

14. **SUSPENSION OF SERVICES.** MARTA may suspend at any time, by written notice to Consultant, the performance of all or any portion of the Services for any amount of time. Upon receipt of a suspension notice, Consultant must, unless the notice requires otherwise, immediately (a) discontinue suspended Services on the date and to the extent specified in the notice, (b) place no further orders or subcontracts for materials, services or facilities with respect to suspended Services, (c) cease advertising to the public as a provider of the suspended Service(s) and (d) take any other reasonable steps to minimize costs associated with the suspension.
15. **MARTA'S RIGHT TO REVIEW AND REJECT.** Any Service, Work Product or other document or item to be submitted or prepared by Consultant hereunder shall be subject to the review of MARTA Authorized Representative. The MARTA Authorized Representative may disapprove, if in MARTA Authorized Representative's sole opinion, the Work Product, Service, document, or item is not in accordance with the requirements of this Contract or sound professional service principles, or is impractical, uneconomical, or unsuited in any way for the purposes for which the Work Product, Service, document, or item is intended or is deemed unsuitable for MARTA purposes by MARTA Authorized Representative. If any of the said items or any portion thereof are so disapproved, Consultant shall revise the items until they meet the approval of MARTA Authorized Representative. However, Consultant shall not be compensated under any provision of this Contract for repeated performance of such disapproved items.
16. **FINAL ACCEPTANCE.** When the Work has been completed, the Consultant shall so advise MARTA in writing. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of such notice, MARTA shall give the Consultant written Notice of Final Acceptance or shall advise the Consultant in writing of any portion of the Work which has yet to be completed or which has not been performed in accordance with the requirements of the applicable Work Order and this Contract. Upon completion of such Work, the Consultant shall again notify MARTA and, within the above specified time period, MARTA shall give the Consultant Notice of Final Acceptance or notice that the specified unfinished Work has not yet been completed or has not been performed in accordance with the requirements of the applicable Work Order and this Contract. In the latter instance, the foregoing procedure with respect to such specified unfinished work will be repeated as necessary until the work is acceptable to MARTA.
17. **AUDIT AND INSPECTION.**
  - (a) Consultant will provide to MARTA, and any entity designated by MARTA, access to Consultant Employees and to Consultant's offices and property for the purpose of performing audits and inspections of Consultant, Consultant Employees and/or any of the relevant information relating to the Services and this Contract. Such audits, inspections and access may be conducted to: (a)

verify the accuracy of charges and invoices; (b) examine Consultant's performance of the Services; (c) monitor compliance with the terms of this Contract, including, without limitation, compliance DEO policies; and (d) any other matters reasonably requested by MARTA. Consultant shall provide, at no additional cost, full cooperation to MARTA and its designated entities in connection with audit functions and examinations by regulatory authorities. All audits and inspections will be conducted during normal business hours (except with respect to Services that are performed during off-hours). Consultant shall promptly respond to and rectify the deficiencies identified in and implement changes suggested by any audit or inspection report.

- (b) If any audit or inspection of charges, invoices or Services reveals that MARTA has overpaid any amounts to Consultant, Consultant shall immediately refund such overpayment and Consultant shall also pay to MARTA interest on the overpayment amount at the rate of one and one-half percent (1.5%) per month (or such maximum rate permissible by applicable law, if lower) from the date the overpayment was made until the date the overpayment is refunded to MARTA by Consultant. Additionally, Consultant acknowledges and agrees that MARTA deduct such amounts due from future invoices until all overpaid amounts (including, interest thereon) are repaid in full.
- (c) Any adjustment to the Consultant's compensation under the Contract shall be subject to audit, and shall include only such costs and other compensation as are allowable under Contract Cost Principles of the Federal Acquisition Regulation System, 48 C.F.R., Ch. 1, Pt. 31. Any allowances for general and administrative and overhead costs, and for profit, with respect to changes shall be negotiated in each case, taking into account the cost, complexity, and risk of performing the change.
- (d) Until the later of: (a) five (5) years after expiration or termination of this Contract; (b) the date that all pending matters relating to this Contract (e.g., disputes) are closed or resolved by the Parties; or (c) the date such retention is no longer required to meet MARTA's records retention policy or any record retention policy imposed by applicable law, if more stringent than MARTA's policy, Consultant will maintain and provide access upon request to the records, data, documents and other information required to fully and completely enable MARTA to enforce its audit rights under this Contract.

#### 18. **CONFLICTS OF INTEREST; PROHIBITED INTERESTS.**

- (a) Conflicts of Interest. The Consultant agrees to execute and return the Certification of No Conflict of Interest attached hereto as **Exhibit E** and to comply with MARTA's Code of Conduct (available on-line at [www.itsmarta.com](http://www.itsmarta.com)). Consultant shall immediately notify MARTA in writing, specifically disclosing any and all potential or actual conflicts of interests, which arise or may arise during the execution of its work in the fulfillment of the requirements of the Contract whether or not MARTA has identified such conflict of interest. MARTA shall make a written determination as to whether a conflict of interest actually exists and the actions to be taken to resolve the conflict of interest, which may include termination of this Contract or the suspension of Services.

The Consultant agrees that neither it nor any company affiliated with the Consultant will bid on or perform any construction work. Further, the Consultant agrees that it will not become a party to any agreement for the performance of professional services for the benefit of any person, other

than MARTA, who is then receiving or entitled to receive, directly or indirectly, any compensation from MARTA in any way related to this Contract.

- (b) Prohibited Interests. The Consultant undertakes, represents, and warrants that none of the following persons, during his tenure or for one year thereafter, has or will have any interest, direct or indirect, in the Contract or in any part of the proceeds hereof: members of MARTA's Board of Directors; officers or employees of MARTA (or former employees of MARTA who within the preceding twelve month period have been a MARTA employee), or of any representative of MARTA in the administration of the Contract; members of or delegates to the United States Congress or to the Georgia legislature; and members of the governing body, and all other officers or employees of MARTA, City of Atlanta or the Counties of Clayton, Cobb, DeKalb, Fulton or Gwinnett, Georgia.
- (c) The Consultant covenants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of the Work under the Contract. The Consultant further covenants that in the performance of the Contract, no person having any such interest shall be employed by the Consultant.
- (d) The Consultant warrants that no person or selling agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure the Contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, excepting bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial or selling agencies maintained by the Consultant for the purpose of securing business.

19. **INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS**. Consultant shall comply with the insurance and bonding requirements set forth on **Exhibit D**. Consultant further agrees that its obligation to indemnify and hold harmless MARTA Indemnitees will not be limited to the limits or terms of Consultant's liability insurance, if any, required under this Consultant.

20. **INDEMNIFICATION**. Consultant shall indemnify and hold MARTA, its agencies and its and their respective officers, directors, employees, advisors, and agents, successors and permitted assigns (collectively, the "MARTA Indemnitees") harmless from any losses, liabilities, damages, demands and claims, and all related costs (including, without limitation, reasonable legal fees and costs of investigation, litigation, settlement, judgment, interest and penalties) arising from claims or actions based upon:

- (a) Consultant or Consultant's sub-consultants, agents or employees' performance, non-performance or breach of this Contract;
- (b) any actual, alleged, threatened or potential violation of any applicable laws by Consultant or Consultant's sub-consultants, agents or employees, to the extent such claim is based on the act or omission of Consultant or any person acting for, in the name of, at the direction or supervision of or on behalf of Consultant;
- (c) death of or injury to any individual caused, in whole or in part, by the tortious conduct of Consultant or any person acting for, in the name of, at the direction or supervision of or on behalf of Consultant;



- (d) matters arising, wholly or in part, from or out of any failure by the Consultant to comply with the standard of care or performance set forth (or incorporated) this Contract, to the extent such liability or claim of liability is caused by the Consultant's negligent acts, errors or omissions arising out of the performance of the Services; and
- (e) damage to, or loss or destruction of, any real or tangible personal property caused, in whole or in part, by the act or omission of Consultant or any person acting for, in the name of, at the direction or supervision of or on behalf of Consultant.

21. **LIMITATION OF LIABILITY.** The maximum aggregate liability of MARTA hereunder is limited to the total of all fees actually paid during then current year under the Contract. MARTA will not be liable or responsible to Consultant for any loss(es), damage(s) or expense(s) that Consultant may sustain or incur if either the quantity or character of services to be provided by MARTA, if any, is changed or is no longer available or is no longer suitable for Consultant's requirements. MARTA will not be liable or responsible to Consultant for any loss(es), damage(s) or expense(s) arising out of, resulting from, relating to or concerning, directly or indirectly, acts of terrorism, including, but not limited to, loss(es), damage(s) or expense(s) sustained or incurred by Consultant as a result of:

- (a) A change in MARTA's or Consultant's business resulting from such terrorist acts;
- (b) The Enactment of laws responding to or concerning terrorist acts; OR
- (c) Any other detrimental effect upon Consultant or its business resulting from such terrorist acts.

22. **WORK PRODUCT.**

- (a) Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Contract, all documents, data, studies, surveys, drawings, plans, designs, specifications, maps, photographs, reports, information, data, specifications, computer programs, technical reports, operating manuals and similar work or other documents, deliverables, and other documents of any kind or character created, prepared or authored by Consultant or any of its sub-consultants for (or at the direction of) MARTA under this Contract, and all intellectual property rights associated with the foregoing items (collectively, the "Work Product") shall be and remain the sole and exclusive property of MARTA upon payment to Consultant. Any of Consultant's or its sub-consultants' works of authorship comprised within the Work Product (whether created alone or in concert with MARTA or a third party) shall be deemed to be 'works made for hire' and made in the course of rendering Services and, whether pursuant to the provisions of Section 101 of the U.S. Copyright Act or other applicable law, such Work Product shall belong exclusively to MARTA. Consultant and its Consultants grant MARTA a non-exclusive, perpetual, worldwide, paid-in-full, royalty-free license to all Work Product not exclusively developed for MARTA under this Contract. MARTA agrees and understands that the Consultant's work product is not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by MARTA or others and that the work product described herein shall be reused for other than its intended purpose solely at MARTA's risk. The Consultant does not warrant the contents of the work product beyond its original intended purpose. In the event of expiration or earlier termination of this Contract (or any Work Order) and the delivery to MARTA of unfinished work product as described therein, the Consultant shall have no liability for errors and omissions in draft or otherwise unfinished work product.

- (b) If any of the Work Product is determined not to be a work made for hire, Consultant assigns to MARTA, worldwide and in perpetuity, all rights, including proprietary rights, copyrights, and related rights, and all extensions and renewals of those rights, in and to the Work Product. If Consultant has any rights to the Work Product that cannot be assigned to MARTA, Consultant unconditionally and irrevocably waives the enforcement of such rights and irrevocably grants MARTA (during the term of such rights) an exclusive, irrevocable, perpetual, transferable, worldwide, fully paid and royalty-free license, with rights to sublicense through multiple levels of sub-licensees, to reproduce, make, have made, create derivative works of, distribute, publicly perform and publicly display by all means, now known or later developed, such rights.
- (c) MARTA shall have the sole and exclusive right to apply for, obtain, register, hold and renew, in its own name or for its own benefit, all patents, copyrights, applications and registrations, renewals and continuations and all other appropriate protection.
- (d) To the extent exclusive title or complete and exclusive ownership rights in any Work Product created by Consultant Employees may not originally vest in MARTA by operation of applicable law, Consultant shall, immediately upon request, unconditionally and irrevocably assign, transfer and convey to MARTA all rights, title and interest in the Work Product.
- (e) Any reports, information and data given to or prepared or assembled by the Consultant under the Contract shall be kept confidential and shall not be made available to any individual or organization by the Consultant without the prior written approval (or direction) of MARTA. The confidentiality obligations set forth in this Section 21(e) shall not apply to such portions of said information that: (i) is known to the Consultant without the obligation of confidentiality prior to its disclosure to MARTA, (ii) which properly became available to the Consultant from a third party source without obligation of confidentiality, (iii) which is now or subsequently became part of the public domain without fault on the part of the Consultant, or (iv) which is required to be disclosed by judicial or governmental order.
- (f) The Consultant shall provide all documentation, information and assistance reasonably required by MARTA to obtain such registrations with respect to claims that third parties have infringed the work products. The Consultant warrants and represents that the work products are original to the Consultant or its sub-consultants and shall not infringe the copyright, trademark, trade secret, privacy, publicity, patent or other intellectual property or proprietary rights of any third party; the Consultant will not attempt to license or transfer to any person or entity any interest in the work products; and the Consultant shall obtain from all sub-consultants written assignment of all rights, title and interest, including copyright and other intellectual property rights, in their contributions to the work products.
- (g) If any invention, improvement, process, design or discovery that is or may be patented under the laws of the United States or any other country is conceived or first actually reduced to practice under this Contract or in the course of its performance, all rights to such patent such invention, improvement, process, design or discovery shall belong to MARTA. The Consultant agrees to assign to MARTA any such copyrights or patent rights to which the Consultant may otherwise be entitled, to execute all documents and to do all other acts as may be necessary or convenient to secure such rights to MARTA, and to secure the undertakings and obligations to MARTA from all employees and sub-consultants and their employees who are engaged in performing Work in accordance with this Contract.

- (h) Should the Consultant bring to the performance of the Work any tools, systems or information used to provide the services hereunder, including computer software (object code and source code), know-how and methodologies, equipment or processes and the intellectual property inherent therein and appurtenant thereto, such material shall remain the property of the Consultant or its suppliers.
- (i) Title to tangible items of equipment, materials, supplies, and furnishings purchased by the Consultant, the cost of which is separately identified for reimbursement purposes to the Consultant pursuant to the Contract, shall pass directly from the supplier to MARTA. Upon final acceptance, expiration or termination of the Contract, the Consultant shall deliver possession of all such tangible items to MARTA.
- (j) All reports, maps, plans, drawings, specifications, and other documents completed as a part of the Contract, other than documents exclusively for internal use within the Consultant or MARTA, shall carry the following notation on the front cover or a title page (or, in the case of maps, in the same block containing the name of MARTA) together with the date (month and year) the document was prepared and the name of MARTA.

"The preparation of this (report, map, plan, drawing, information) has been financed in part through a grant from the U. S. Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration, under the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended, and in part by the taxes of the citizens of Clayton, DeKalb and Fulton Counties of the State of Georgia."

**23. CONSULTANT REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES.** As of the Effective Date and continuing throughout the Term, Consultant represents and warrants to MARTA that:

- (a) Authority. Consultant is duly incorporated or formed, validly existing and is in good standing under the laws of the state in which it is incorporated or formed, and is in good standing in each other jurisdiction (including, without limitation, the State of Georgia) where the failure to be in good standing would have a material adverse effect on its business or its ability to perform its obligations under this Contract. Consultant has all necessary power and authority to enter into and perform its obligations under this Contract and within the State of Georgia, and the execution and delivery of this Contract and the consummation of the transactions contemplated by this Contract have been duly authorized by all necessary actions on its part. This Contract constitutes a legal, valid and binding obligation of Consultant, enforceable against it in accordance with its terms. No action, suit or proceeding in which Consultant is a party that may restrain or question this Contract or the provision of Services by Consultant is pending or threatened.
- (b) Professional Standards. The Services will be performed in a professional and workmanlike manner in accordance with the best industry standards and the professional standards used in well managed operations similar to the Services.
- (c) Materials and Equipment. Any equipment or materials provided or used by Consultant shall be of merchantable quality and fit for the purposes for which they are intended. Further, Consultant shall maintain any equipment or materials provided or used by Consultant in good working order, in compliance with the best industry practices, all applicable laws and the Scope of Work.

(d) Intellectual Property Rights. None of the processes or procedures utilized by Consultant to fulfill its obligations hereunder, nor any of the materials and methodologies used by Consultant in fulfilling its obligations hereunder, nor any of the Services shall infringe any third party's intellectual property rights or privacy, publicity or other rights.

24. **GEORGIA OPEN RECORDS ACT**. Information provided to MARTA is subject to disclosure under the Georgia Open Records Act, as amended from time to time ("GORA"). PURSUANT TO O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72(A)(34), *an entity submitting records containing trade secrets that wishes to keep such records confidential under this paragraph shall submit and attach to the records an affidavit affirmatively declaring that specific information in the records constitute trade secrets pursuant to Article 27 of Chapter 1 of Title 10 [O.C.G.A § 10-1-760 et seq.]*.

25. **ILLEGAL IMMIGRATION REFORM AND ENFORCEMENT ACT**. This Contract is subject to the Illegal Immigration Reform and Enforcement Act of 2011 ("Act"). Pursuant to Act, Consultant must actively participate in the E-Verify Program established by the United States Department of Homeland Security to verify the work authorization status of Consultant's employees for the duration of this Contract. For the entire Term of this Contract, Consultant must comply with the Act (O.C.G.A. 13-10-90 et seq.), as it may be amended from time to time, including but not limited to, obtaining affidavits from Consultant's sub-consultants and sub-sub-consultants demonstrating their participation in the E-Verify Program for the duration of their contract with Consultant. Consultant shall further include the obligation to obtain affidavits demonstrating E-Verify participation in its subcontracts with all of Consultant's sub-consultants and sub-sub-consultants that perform all or part of the Services in this Contract.

It is not the intent of this section to provide detailed information or legal advice concerning the Act. Consultant is responsible to independently appraise itself of and comply with the requirements of the Act and to assess its effect on MARTA contracts and its participation in those contracts. For additional information on the E-Verify program or to enroll in the program, go to <https://e-verify.uscis.gov/enroll>.

26. **GENERAL**.

(a) Notices. Any notices required or permitted by this Contract shall be in writing and sent to the respective Party at the address on page one (1) of this Contract, and if to MARTA, a copy to the head of Contracts, Procurement & Materials at 2424 Piedmont Road NE, Atlanta, Georgia, 30324, and shall be deemed delivered: (a) when delivered by hand or courier or by overnight delivery with signature receipt required; (b) when sent by facsimile with a copy sent by another means specified in this Section; or (c) three (3) days after the date of mailing by United States certified mail, return receipt requested with all postage prepaid. Any Party may change its address for communications by notice in accordance with this Section.

(b) Waiver. Any waiver by either Party or failure to enforce their rights under this Contract shall be deemed applicable only to the specific matter and shall not be deemed a continuing waiver or failure to enforce any other rights under this Contract, and this Contract shall continue in full force and effect as though such previous waiver or failure to enforce any rights had not occurred. No supplement, modification, amendment, or waiver of this Contract will be binding on MARTA unless executed in writing by MARTA's Authorized Representative.

- (c) Assignment. Neither this Contract, nor any interest, right or obligation arising under the Contract, may be assigned, encumbered, transferred, licensed or subcontracted in any manner by Consultant without the prior written consent of MARTA's General Manager (or his/her designee), and any attempt to do so without such written consent shall be void *ab initio*. MARTA's General Manager (or his/her designee) may grant or deny consent to assign, subcontract, license or encumber this Contract or the Services in his/her sole discretion. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if Consultant wants to assign all (or a portion) of this Contract to a corporate affiliate of the Consultant that is properly licensed and qualified (pursuant to MARTA's reasonable determination) to perform the Services, the consent of MARTA shall not be unreasonably withheld unless such assignment violates the MARTA Code of Ethics or the requirements of the MARTA Act or other applicable law, regulation or existing contract to which MARTA is subject. The Consultant shall not subcontract all or any portion of the Services under the Contract without the prior written approval of MARTA.
- (d) Severability. In the event that any provision of this Contract is declared invalid, unenforceable or unlawful, such provision shall be deemed omitted and the remainder of this Contract shall not be affected and shall continue to be enforceable to the greatest extent under applicable law. Any provision of this Contract which contemplates performance or observance subsequent to any termination or expiration of this Contract or which must survive in order to give effect to its meaning, shall survive the expiration or termination of this Contract.
- (e) Independent Consultant. Consultant is an independent Consultant of MARTA and nothing in this Contract shall be deemed to constitute Consultant and MARTA as partners, joint ventures', or principal and agent, or be construed as requiring or permitting the sharing of profits or losses. Neither party has the authority to represent or bind or create any legal obligations for or on behalf of the other party. The Consultant, if an individual, agrees to perform all work under the Contract as an independent Consultant and not as an employee or agent of MARTA.
- (f) Entire Contract. This Contract and any exhibits or addenda attached hereto or referenced herein shall comprise the entire agreement of the parties relating to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all previous communications, representations, or agreements (oral or written) between the parties with respect to such subject matter. This Contract may only be amended or modified by a writing executed by each party's authorized representative and each such writing shall be deemed to incorporate all of the Contract Documents, except to the extent that MARTA is authorized under this Contract or applicable law to issue unilateral changes to this Contract. CONSULTANT MAY NOT UNILATERALLY AMEND OR MODIFY THIS CONTRACT BY INCLUDING PROVISIONS IN ANY BUSINESS FORMS, WHICH SHALL BE DEEMED OBJECTED TO BY MARTA AND OF NO FORCE OR EFFECT. No presumption of any applicable law relating to the interpretation of contracts against the drafter shall apply to this Contract.
- (g) Gender, Exhibits and Attachments and Time. Words of any gender used in this Contract shall be held and construed to include any other gender and words in the singular number shall be held to include the plural, unless the context otherwise requires. All exhibits, appendices, attachments, riders and addenda referred to in this Contract are incorporated into this Contract and made a part hereof for all intents and purposes. Time is of the essence with regard to each provision of this Contract. If Consultant is other than a natural person, Consultant shall deliver to MARTA such legal documentation as MARTA may request to evidence the authority of those signing this Contract to bind Consultant.

- (h) Drug-Free Workplace Policy. Consultant acknowledges that pursuant to the Federal Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1989, the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance is prohibited on MARTA property or in the performance of any of the Services and that MARTA maintains compliance with this law and all personnel conducting business on MARTA's property are subject to MARTA's drug-free workplace policy guidelines as the same may be amended from time to time.
- (i) Identification of Personnel Security. Consultant acknowledges and agrees that all Consultant's personnel that enter upon MARTA's property must be provided (at Consultant's sole expense) distinctive identification badges showing the employer's name, employee's name, employee's photograph, employee's job title, and any employee identification number assigned to such employee by Consultant. All of Consultant's personnel shall display these badges prominently upon their person while on MARTA property. MARTA will only allow properly identified and certified personnel of the Consultant on its property. MARTA shall have the right to require Consultant to conduct background checks on the Consultant's employees and to remove from MARTA's property any employee MARTA considers incompetent, careless, or who constitutes a security risk or safety hazard. The Consultant's personnel must have all appropriate documentation, as determined by MARTA's project manager, on their person to gain access to MARTA's property.
- (j) Usufruct. To the extent MARTA granted Consultant the right to use any real property owned by MARTA, all of Consultant's rights hereunder constitute a usufruct, which is not subject to levy or sale. No estate shall pass out of MARTA.
- (k) Attorneys' Fees. If MARTA should bring any action under this Contract, then Consultant agrees in each and any such case to pay to MARTA all costs, including, but not limited to, court costs and reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred by MARTA in connection therewith.
- (l) Governing Law. In the performance of the Work, the Consultant agrees that, at no additional cost to MARTA, it will comply with any and all laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations of any government, whether national, state or local and of any agency of such government (including, without limitation, MARTA) which relates to or in any manner affects the performance of the Services. This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Georgia without regard to its choice of law principles. The Parties hereby submit and consent to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Superior Courts of Fulton County, Georgia or in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia and irrevocably agree that all actions or proceedings relating to this Contract will be litigated in such courts, and each of the Parties waives any objection which it may have based on improper venue or forum *non conveniens* to the conduct of any such action or proceeding in such court.
- (m) Force Majeure. Neither Party shall be deemed to be in breach of this Contract by reason of a failure to perform any of its obligations hereunder to the extent that such failure is caused by strike or labor troubles, unavailability of materials or utilities, riots, rebellion, terrorist attack, insurrection, invasion, war, action or interference of governmental authorities (other than MARTA), acts of God, or any other cause whether similar or dissimilar to the foregoing which is reasonably beyond the control of the Parties (collectively "Force Majeure Event"). If either Party claims the occurrence of a Force Majeure Event, such Party must promptly give notice to the

other of the existence of such Force Majeure Event, the nature and extent thereof, the obligation hereunder affected thereby and the actions to be taken to abate or terminate such event. In no event shall the failure to pay any amount (or have the ability to pay any amount) be deemed a Force Majeure Event under this Contract.

- (n) Use of MARTA's Name; Public Relations. The Consultant shall not refer to MARTA or use MARTA's name for purposes of advertising or public relations without MARTA's prior written consent, which may be granted or withheld in MARTA's sole discretion. Any such reference or use shall be strictly factual, and shall not in any way imply that MARTA endorses Consultant or the services Consultant provides. During the performance of the Work, if the Consultant has contact with private citizens, governments or their agents, associations, professional organizations, business concerns or their representatives, or the general public, the Consultant shall make every effort to maintain good public relations. The Consultant should be thoroughly cognizant of the importance of good public relations to MARTA, as well as to the successful completion of the Consultant's particular assignment.

27. **ENERGY CONSERVATION REQUIREMENTS.** The Consultant agrees to comply with applicable mandatory energy efficiency standards and policies of applicable state energy conservation plans issued in accordance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. §§ 6321 et seq., except to the extent that the Federal government determines otherwise in writing. To the extent applicable, the Consultant agrees to perform an energy assessment for any building constructed, reconstructed, or modified with FTA assistance, as provided in FTA regulations, "Requirements for Energy Assessments," 49 C.F.R. Part 622, Subpart C.

28. **CLEAN WATER REQUIREMENTS.**

- (a) The Consultant agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq. The Consultant agrees to report each violation to MARTA and understands and agrees that MARTA will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to FTA and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") Regional Office.
- (b) The Consultant also agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$100,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FTA.

29. **CLEAN AIR REQUIREMENTS.**

- (a) The Consultant agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 7401 et seq. The Consultant agrees to report each violation to MARTA and understands and agrees that MARTA will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to FTA and the appropriate EPA Regional Office.
- (b) The Consultant also agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$100,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FTA.

30. **FEDERAL CHANGES.** The Consultant shall at all times comply with all applicable FTA regulations, policies, procedures and directives, including without limitation those listed directly or by reference in the Contract between MARTA and FTA, as they may be amended or promulgated from time to time

during the term of this Contract. The Consultant's failure to so comply shall constitute a material breach of this Contract.

**31. PROGRAM FRAUD AND FALSE OR FRAUDULENT STATEMENTS AND RELATED ACTS.**

- (a) Civil Fraud. Consultant acknowledges and agrees that the provisions of the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986, as amended, 31 U.S.C. §§ 3801 et seq., and U.S. DOT regulations, "Program Fraud Civil Remedies," 49 C.F.R. Part 31, apply to its actions pertaining to this Contract. Upon execution of this Contract, the Consultant certifies or affirms the truthfulness and accuracy of each statement it has made, it makes, or it may make (or causes to be made) pertaining this Contract or the FTA assigned project for which the Services are being performed. In addition to other penalties that may apply, the Consultant furthers acknowledges and agrees that if it makes (or causes to be made) a false, fictitious, or fraudulent claim, statement, submission or certification, the Federal government has the right and may impose penalties of the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986, as amended, on the Consultant to the extent the Federal government deems appropriate.
- (b) Criminal Fraud. Consultant also acknowledges and agrees that if it makes, or causes to be made, a false, fictitious, or fraudulent claim, statement, submission, or certification to the Federal government under a contract connected with a project that is financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance originally awarded by FTA under the authority under 49 U.S.C. chapter 53 or any other Federal law, the Federal government reserves the right to impose the penalties of 49 U.S.C. § 5323(l), 18 U.S.C. § 1001, or other applicable Federal law on the Consultant to the extent the Federal government deems appropriate.
- (c) The Consultant agrees to include the above two clauses (i.e., Sections 30(a) and (b)) in each subcontract financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FTA. It is further agreed that the clauses shall not be modified, except to identify the sub-consultant who will be subject to the provisions.

**32. LOBBYING.** Consultant agrees to comply with the requirement of 31 U.S.C. § 1352(a), the Byrd Anti Lobbying Amendment, which prohibits the use of Federal assistance to pay the costs of influencing any officer or employee of a Federal agency, Member of Congress, officer of Congress or employee of a member of Congress, in connection with making or extending the Grant Contract or Cooperative Contract.

Consultant shall file the certification required by U.S. DOT regulations, "New Restrictions on Lobbying", 49 C.F.R. Part 20, modified as necessary by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federally appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any public agency, a member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. 1352. Each tier shall also disclose the name of any registrant under the Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995 who has made lobbying contracts on its behalf with non-Federal funds with respect to that Federal contract, grant or award covered by 31 U.S.C. 1352. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to-tier up to the Authority.



33. **INCORPORATION OF FTA TERMS.** The provisions in this Contract include, in part, certain Standard Terms and Conditions required by U. S. DOT, whether or not expressly set forth in the preceding Contract provisions. All contractual provisions required by U. S. DOT, as set forth in FTA Circular 4220.1F, are hereby incorporated by reference. Anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding, all FTA mandated terms shall be deemed to control in the event of a conflict with other provisions contained in this Contract. The Consultant shall not perform any act, fail to perform any act, or refuse to comply with any MARTA requests, which would cause MARTA to be in violation of the FTA terms and conditions.

34. **SUSPENSION OF WORK DURING ALERTS ISSUED UNDER THE NATIONAL TERRORISM ADVISORY SERVICE (NTAS).** When the Secretary of Homeland Security announces an alert under the National Terrorism Advisory Services (NTAS), whether such alert is issued publically or otherwise, the Authority shall have the right to suspend or delay completion of work under this Contract and take additional action as the Authority deems necessary to secure the Authority's facilities as follows:

- (a) Elevated Threat Alert: The Authority shall have the right to delay or suspend work, as determined in its sole discretion, monitor all work areas and the Consultant's personnel and equipment entering work areas until such alert expires.
- (b) Imminent Threat Alert: The Authority shall have the right to suspend all non-critical maintenance and capital work, as determined in its sole discretion, and to restrict or deny access to work areas until such alert expires. The Authority shall provide notice to the Consultant, as soon as is practicable, of the receipt of a NTAS Alert and the effect such alert will have upon the work of the Consultant. To facilitate the provision of such notice, the Consultant is required to provide the Authority's Project Manager with emergency contact information in the form of cell phone numbers, facsimile numbers and e-mail addresses to which such notices may be forwarded, and to keep said numbers current. Notice or attempted notice given to the most recent points of contact shall be deemed to be sufficient notice to the Consultant that work shall be delayed or suspended in accordance with this paragraph. Any delay or suspension of work required under this Section shall not entitle the Consultant to any claims for additional compensation under this Contract.
- (c) Should the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) or the Secretary of Homeland Security adopt a different method of identifying threats to homeland security, or if the FTA or the Secretary of Homeland Security adopt rules binding upon the Authority for the suspension of work which differ from those set forth herein, this Contract shall be modified by written agreement of the parties to reflect such changes.

35. **NO FEDERAL GOVERNMENT OBLIGATIONS TO THIRD PARTIES.**

- (a) Consultant acknowledges and agrees that, notwithstanding any concurrence by the federal government in or approval of the solicitation or award of this Contract, absent the express written consent by the federal government, the federal government is not a party to this Contract and shall not be subject to any obligations or liabilities to the Authority, the Consultant, or any other party (whether or not a party to that contract) pertaining to any matter resulting from the underlying Contract.

- (b) The Consultant agrees to include Section 35(a) above in each subcontract financed in whole or in part with federal assistance provided by FTA and that Section 35(a) shall not be modified, except to identify the sub-consultant who will be subject to its provisions.

**36. ACCESS TO THIRD PARTY CONTRACT RECORDS.**

- (a) Consultant agrees to maintain all books, records, accounts, reports, agreements and supporting materials required, created or generated under this Contract for a period of not less than five (5) years after the date of expiration or earlier termination of this Contract. In the event of litigation of settlement of claims arising from the performance of this Contract, the Consultant agrees to maintain such records until the Authority, the FTA Administrator, the Comptroller General, or any of the duly authorized representatives have disposed of all such litigation, appeals, claims or exceptions related thereto. During the course of this Contract and for five (5) years thereafter from the date of transmission of the final expenditure report, the Consultant agrees to maintain intact and readily accessible all data, documents, reports, records, sub-agreements, leases, third party contracts and supporting materials related to this contract as the Federal government may require, and:
- (b) The Consultant to permit the U.S. Secretary of Transportation, the Comptroller General of the United States, and, to the extent appropriate, the State, or their authorized representatives, upon their request to inspect all work, materials, payrolls, and other data, and to audit the books, records, and accounts of the Consultant pertaining to this Contract, as required by 49 U.S.C. § 5325(g).

**37. SUSPENSION AND DEBARMENT.**

- (a) This Contract is a covered transaction for purposes of Executive Orders Nos. 12549 and 12689, "Debarment and Suspension," 31 U.S.C. § 6101 note, and U.S. DOT regulations, "Non-procurement Suspension and Debarment," 2 CFR Part 1200, which adopts and supplements the provisions of U.S. Office of Management and Budget (U.S. OMB) "Guidelines to Agencies on Government wide Debarment and Suspension (Non-procurement)," 2 CFR Part 180. As such, the Consultant agrees to provide a debarment and suspension certification containing information about the debarment and suspension status of itself and its principals. The Consultant agrees that it shall refrain from entering into any contract of any amount to a debarred or suspended sub-consultant, and to obtain a similar certification from any sub-consultants, seeking a contract exceeding \$25,000. Consultant agrees to and assures its sub-consultants and other participant at any tier of the underlying Contract will review the "Excluded Parties Listing System" at <http://epls.gov/> before entering into any agreement or other arrangement in connection with the underlying Contract. The Consultant is required to pass this requirement on to sub-consultants seeking subcontracts over \$25,000.
- (b) The certification(s) contained or referenced in this Section 37 is a material representation of fact upon which reliance will be placed when this Contract is entered into. If it is later determined that the Consultant knowingly rendered an erroneous certification, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal government, the Authority may pursue available remedies, including suspension and/or debarment. The Consultant shall provide immediate written notice to the Authority if at any time the Consultant learns that its certification was erroneous when submitted or has become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.

(c) Consultant also agrees to include the requirements set forth in this Section 37 in each subcontract exceeding \$25,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FTA.

38. **ADA ACCESS.** The Consultant agrees to comply with 49 U.S.C. § 5301(d), which states the Federal policy that elderly individuals and individuals with disabilities have the same right as other individuals to use public transportation services and facilities, and that special efforts shall be made in planning and designing those services and facilities to implement transportation accessibility rights for elderly individuals and individuals with disabilities. The Consultant also agrees to comply with all applicable provisions of section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, with 29 U.S.C. § 794, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability; with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), as amended, 42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 *et seq.*, which requires that accessible facilities and services be made available to individuals with disabilities; and with the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968, as amended, 42 U.S.C. §§ 4151 *et seq.*, which requires that buildings and public accommodations be accessible to individuals with disabilities; and with other laws and amendments thereto pertaining to access for individuals with disabilities that may be applicable. In addition, the Consultant agrees to comply with applicable implementing Federal regulations any later amendments thereto, and agrees to follow applicable Federal directives except to the extent FTA approves otherwise in writing.
39. **FLY AMERICA.** To the extent applicable, the Consultant agrees to comply with Section 5 of the International Air Transportation Fair Competitive Practices Act of 1974, as amended, 49 U.S.C. § 40118, and U.S. GSA regulations, "Use of United States Flag Air Carriers," 41 C.F.R. §§ 301-10.131 through 301-10.143, which provide that recipients and sub-recipients of Federal funds and their Consultants are required to use U.S. Flag air carriers for U.S. Government-financed international air travel and transportation of their personal effects or property, to the extent such service is available, unless travel by foreign air carrier is a matter of necessity, as defined by the Fly America Act. The Consultant shall submit, if a foreign air carrier was used, an appropriate certification or memorandum adequately explaining why service by a U.S. flag air carrier was not available or why it was necessary to use a foreign air carrier and shall, in any event, provide a certificate of compliance with the Fly America requirements. Further, the Consultant agrees to include the requirements of this section in all subcontracts that may involve international air transportation.
40. **CONFORMANCE WITH NATIONAL INTELLIGENT TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM (ITS) ARCHITECTURE.** To the extent applicable, the Consultant agrees to conform to the National Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Architecture and Standards as required by SAFETEA-LU § 5307(c), 23 U.S.C. § 512 note, and follow the provisions of FTA Notice, "FTA National ITS Architecture Policy on Transit Projects," 66 Fed. Reg. 1455 *et seq.*, January 8, 2001, and any other implementing directives FTA may issue at a later date, except to the extent FTA determines otherwise in writing.
41. **EXECUTION OF CONTRACT.** This Contract will not become binding on MARTA and MARTA will incur no liability under it until it has been duly executed by Consultant, returned to MARTA with all required submittals, including insurance and bonding, executed by MARTA's authorized signatory and delivered to Consultant.

## EXHIBIT A SCOPE OF SERVICES

### SECTION I-BACKGROUND

MARTA is planning new services, infrastructure upgrades, transit partnerships, and is currently undergoing environmental reviews for and envisions new high capacity transit expansion in the Georgia 400, I-20 East, Clifton Corridor and Clayton County corridors. Additionally, the City of Atlanta voted in November for an additional ½ penny on the dollar in funding for MARTA expansion.

#### **1.0 CORRIDOR EXPANSION PROJECTS**

MARTA's long range plan is closely correlated with the regional transit vision articulated within the Transit Planning Board Concept 3 Plan and has been formalized by the MARTA Board of Directors. This vision recognizes MARTA's role as the core of the regional transit system needed to accommodate the anticipated growth in the Atlanta region over the next 25 years. The vision also features expanding the existing MARTA system. The following initiatives have been identified as priorities in no particular ranking and are included in the approved 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> Amendments to the Rapid Transit Contract and Assistance Agreement.

- 1.1 **I-20 East Transit Initiative:** The Local Preferred Alternative (LPA), as adopted by the MARTA Board of Directors in April 2012, is comprised of a new Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) service along I-20 between downtown Atlanta and Wesley Chapel Road, east of I-285 in DeKalb County and the extension of MARTA's existing east-west heavy rail transit (HRT) line from the Indian Creek Station to the Mall at Stonecrest in southeastern DeKalb County. The BRT and HRT components of the LPA are being evaluated in separate environmental studies. This effort has been supported by an interactive public involvement/education program with active participation of a board based stakeholder group.
- 1.2 **Clifton Corridor Transit Initiative:** between 2009 and 2012, MARTA and the Clifton Corridor Transportation Management Association (CCTMA) partnered to conduct the Clifton Corridor Transit Initiative - Alternatives Analysis (AA). The Clifton Corridor AA involved in investigating the need for high-capacity transit connections between MARTA's Lindbergh Center/Armour Yard area in north-central Atlanta to the Clifton Road employment centers and the City of Decatur in west-central DeKalb County. A Locally Preferred Alternative (LPA) was adopted by the MARTA Board of Directors in April 2012 and it encompassed 8.8 miles of new light rail service from MARTA's Lindbergh Center Station to Avondale MARTA Station and generally includes operations adjacent to the CSX right-of-way. The LPA also includes in-street operations within the medians of Clifton Road (through the CDC/Emory area), Scott Boulevard, North Decatur Road, DeKalb Industrial Way and North Arcadia Avenue. The environmental impact study (EIS) is underway and is scheduled to be completed in late 2017.
- 1.3 **GA 400 Corridor Transit Initiative – Connect 400:** The Connect 400 – Alternatives Analysis (AA) was launched in late 2011 to identify a potential high-capacity transit solution within a study area encompassing the GA 400 expressway between I-285 in the City of Sandy Springs and McGinnis Ferry Road in northern Fulton County. An Alternatives Analysis (AA) was completed in December 2013 to identify the high capacity transit option that best addresses the identified transportation problems within the corridor. Phase I of Early Scoping for this study was conducted in September and October 2013. Phase II of Early Scoping, began in the summer of 2014, eliminating LRT, and advancing HRT and BRT as the preferred technology. In March 2015, the MARTA Board of Directors

approved resolution considering three high-capacity rapid transit alternatives, including Heavy Rail Transit (HRT) - the Locally Preferred Alternative (LPA) - and two lower cost Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) alternatives. The Draft Environmental Impact Statement is anticipated to be completed in the Spring of 2017 and a Final Environmental Impact Statement/Record of Decision (ROD) to be completed in Winter 2017.

- 1.4 **Comprehensive Operations Analysis (COA):** MARTA's Comprehensive Operations Analysis (COA) was launched in 2014 and analyzed existing rail, bus and Mobility paratransit services and recommended service changes based on analysis of existing ridership, service performance, and market conditions and supported by public outreach. Existing service was evaluated based on route productivity, subsidy per passenger, and other key performance indicators (KPIs) to help determine changes to enhance the overall network. Based on the analysis, bus routes were identified as good candidates for increased investment while other routes were identified as candidates for consolidation, realignment, changes in service type, or improved marketing. Improvements in rail service and in the Mobility program were also identified. The report then recommends changes to service characteristics that support improved service, including changes in the fare system, service operating policies, route capacity, and on-going service monitoring. Finally, the report details the capital asset needs necessary to support the implementation of the COA. The COA was approved by the MARTA Board in the spring of 2016. The recommended changes are planned to be phased over the course of ten years as funding becomes available.
- 1.5 **Clayton County High Capacity Transit Initiative:** The Clayton County High Capacity Transit Initiative was launched Spring 2016 to explore different transit alignment and technology options to improve Clayton County's transportation mobility, accessibility, and connectivity to the Atlanta region and provide greater access to jobs, congestion relief, environmental benefits and economic development within the County. MARTA has begun identifying goals and objectives for the study based on data collection, technical analysis and public input/support. This process will define and evaluate a range of potential transit alternatives to best meet the needs of Clayton County. The study area includes all of Clayton County and portions of southeast Fulton County, southwest DeKalb County, northeast Fayette County, and northwest Henry County. High capacity transit service will be designed to connect existing MARTA rail service in Fulton County with major destinations in Clayton County. Early scoping is scheduled early 2017 and a Locally Preferred Alternative (LPA) is anticipated by Spring of 2017. The completion of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) is anticipated in Winter of 2017 and Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS)/Record of Decision (ROD) to be completed by Fall/Winter 2018.
- 1.6 **City of Atlanta Expansion:** In November 2016, City of Atlanta voted for the TSPLOST that provides for an additional ½ penny on the dollar in funding for MARTA to begin moving forward on projects in the City of Atlanta jurisdiction. The increase in sales tax revenues will generate capital funding to expand, enhance, repair and maintain the MARTA bus and rail system. It is estimated that an additional ½ penny in tax revenue for MARTA would raise approximately \$65 million per year. Over the 40-year period of the proposed tax, there would be approximately \$2.5 billion in new funding dedicated to expanding the system in the City of Atlanta. The potential expansion projects are categorized as High Capacity Improvements and Bus service improvements. Potential High Capacity Improvements identified include seven (7) Light Rail Transit (LRT); two (2) Heavy Rail Transit (HRT); one (1) Bus Rapid Transit (BRT); and two (2) multi-jurisdictional LRT and BRT projects. Additional High Capacity Improvement considerations are station enhancements at the City of Atlanta rail stations and capacity improvements including infill stations and 30 additional

railcars for the Blue/Green Line. Potential Bus Service Improvements include seven (7) Arterial Rapid Transit routes; three (3) Transit Centers; increased frequency for local service; increased service during off-peak; and Community Circulator Service.

## **2.0 MARTA'S DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING**

The MARTA Planning Department oversees a wide variety of programs and activities that range from corridor planning to environmental analysis, transit oriented development and transit research and analysis. MARTA's Planning Department generally falls into two functional areas:

- 2.1 Transit System Planning
- 2.2 Research and Analysis

**2.1 Transit System Planning:** The Office of Transit System Planning (TSP) is responsible for the planning, design, scheduling and monitoring of all bus and rail services. This includes development of service plans as required for the Authority's operating budget, intermediate service initiative, and long range expansion projects. TSP has two planning units.

### **(a) Service Planning and Scheduling Branch**

- I. Develops bus and rail service plans with community input.
- II. Evaluates the efficiency and effectiveness of existing services.
- III. Oversees the scheduling of all bus and rail service in coordination with Operations and Maintenance to ensure safe, efficient and cost effective transportation for MARTA's riders.
- IV. Develops and update MARTA's Service Standards that are approved annually by MARTA's Board of Directors.

### **(b) Special Projects & Analysis Branch**

- I. Coordinates the Authority's bus stop management efforts.
- II. Provides core Geographic Information Systems (GIS) capabilities and conducts special service analysis and mapping.
- III. Reviews environmental impacts, historical and archaeological studies as required by State and Federal laws.
- IV. Conducts Long-range Planning to include guiding system expansion projects through the Federal Funding process, ridership modeling and identifying future locations for capital expansion projects (fixed-guideway, bus-rapid transit).

Each of these planning units is a program unto itself and is responsible for implementing planning activities consistent with the development of existing and future rail and bus services.

**2.2 Office of Research and Analysis:** The Office of Research and Analysis (R&A) is comprised of the units of Transit Research, Transit Analysis, and Service Monitoring. The Office is responsible for conducting quantitative and qualitative studies on issues that affect all aspects of the transit experience. R&A also collects and analyzes passenger and revenue data to assess system service

levels and performance. Additionally, R&A is responsible for supporting system sustainability by validating automated systems. R&A has three business units:

**(a) Transit Research Branch**

- I. Captures system usage, customer demographics, and feedback, while tracking industry standards data for the evaluation of service delivery.
- II. Assists other MARTA departments in discerning best practices in the transit industry by conducting peer studies on various timely subjects.
- III. Conducts ad hoc studies to assess the impact of dynamic agents such as car ownership, high gas prices, and sensitivity to environmental concerns.

**(b) Transit Analysis Branch**

- I. Collects data and perform calculations on a monthly basis in support of mandated reporting to the Federal Transit Administration's National Transit Database.
- II. Analyze historical data in order to forecast future MARTA passenger revenue and ridership for budget purposes.
- III. Tracks trends in the data produced by the Bus Radio / Automatic Vehicle Location / Automatic Passenger Counter system and by the Breeze Automatic Fare Collection system, for the purpose of system health monitoring and sustainability.

**(c) Service Monitoring Branch**

- I. Collects, analyzes and reports system wide MARTA bus/rail ridership data, bus and rail on time performance, system parking, and reciprocal data and supports system sustainability and validation efforts. National Transit Database (NTD) and service level data are collected, analyzed and reported thru Title VI Assessment and On Time Performance reports.
- II. Conducts Rail line-load and load factor analysis - tracking impact of mark-up changes and new initiative such as BRT and Street Car Project.

**3.0 MARTA'S OFFICE OF TRANSIT ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT (TOD) AND REAL ESTATE**

The Office of Transit Oriented Development and Real Estate is responsible for all transit oriented development, real estate activities, concession programs development. These responsibilities are divided among two planning units:

**3.1 Transit Oriented Development Branch**

- (a) Oversees planning and activities associated with preparing MARTA owned property for joint development.
- (b) Identifies prospective properties to be offered for development, prepares and evaluates competitive solicitations and markets development opportunities.
- (c) Conducts transaction analysis, negotiation and structuring.



- (d) Participates in community based charrettes, station are master planning efforts and coordination with local and regional stakeholders.
- (e) Coordinates and facilitates TOD on privately owned property.

### **3.2 Real Estate Branch**

- (a) Manages disposition of MARTA owned property to private parties and property transfers to public agencies.
- (b) Works with adjacent property owners to facilitate TOD on private property.
- (c) Acquires property for system expansion and new facilities.
- (d) Responsible for asset management of all MARTA property, including administration of all leases and licenses.
- (e) Identifies new opportunities, develop proposals and management of concessions on MARTA property.

## **SECTION II – SCOPE OF SERVICE**

The Scope of Services shall, include but is not limited, to these comprehensive functional Planning areas below:

### **4.1 Corridor Planning and Facility Planning Support Services**

### **4.2 Transit Planning Support Services**

### **4.3 Transit Oriented Development (TOD) and Real Estate Valuation**

The Program Manager will assign specific projects to the Consultant(s) through the issuance of Task Orders. Task Orders could include, but are not limited to, providing those services listed under “Description of Required Services”.

## **4.0 DESCRIPTION OF REQUIRED SERVICES**

The task orders will include an agreed upon work program with detailed scopes, budgets and schedules of completion. Work efforts may include, but are not limited to, the following:

### **4.1 Corridor/ Facility/ Joint Development Planning Support Services**

Corridor / facility / joint development specific tasks apply to services necessary to support future high capacity transit corridors as identified in the Regional Transit Plan (RTP) and other transit facility studies identified by MARTA. Specifically, the project specific scope of work refers to tasks necessary to complete Feasibility Studies, Corridor studies, Conceptual Engineering, Preliminary Engineering, National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA) environmental documentation and Major Transit Facility studies. Most importantly, federally funded projects are subject to a completion of appropriate NEPA documentation and pursuant to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) 49 USC 5309(e) (1) (A) FTA, the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA), as well as U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) planning guidelines are subject to change, it is expected that the Consultant is knowledgeable of the latest updates at all times.

The Consultant shall provide planning support services in conformance with FTA's New Starts, Small Starts and/or Core Capacity Guidance for conducting the following activities based on the latest FTA Guidance:

**4.1.1 Corridor Studies:** The Consultant shall provide project specific planning processes and documentation in support of FTA's New Starts, Small Starts, or Core Capacity project development process in the following disciplines:

- (a) New / Small Starts Reporting
- (b) Project Management
- (c) Transit Planning
- (d) Land Use Planning
- (e) Transportation Modeling
- (f) Conceptual Engineering/Preliminary Engineering
- (g) Traffic Engineering
- (h) Travel Forecasting
- (i) Geotechnical Investigation
- (j) Utilities
- (k) Surveying
- (l) Cost Estimating
- (m) Project agreements
- (n) Urban Design
- (o) Economic & Market Analysis
- (p) Graphic Design
- (q) Landscape Architecture
- (r) Geographic Information Systems
- (s) Administrative Services

**4.1.2 Environmental Impact Statement / Environmental Assessment / Categorical Exclusion (EIS / EA / CE):** For Environmental Documents the Consultant must be able to assess and evaluate potential environmental impacts from proposed transit and joint development projects and prepare Environmental Impact Statements, Environmental Assessments, and Categorical Exclusions as required per NEPA and the FTA. The Consultant must be able to identify existing conditions, environmental concerns/issues (i.e., hazardous materials, historic and archaeological resources, Section 4(f), etc.) before and/or during the Project Development Phase of FTA's Capital Investment Grant program.

The Consultant shall provide analysis and prepare technical reports for the following disciplines:

- (a) Land Acquisition and Relocation
- (b) Existing Land Use
- (c) Consistency with Local Plans

- (d) Economic Impacts
- (e) Growth & Growth-Induced Impacts
- (f) Traffic/Parking/Pedestrians/Bicycles
- (g) Air Quality and Greenhouse Gases
- (h) Noise and Vibration
- (i) Energy Requirements and Potential for Conservation
- (j) Historic, Archaeological and Cultural Resources
- (k) Section 4(f)/6(f) Resources
- (l) Visual and Aesthetics
- (m) Community Disruption
- (n) Environmental Justice
- (o) Hazardous Materials including monitoring and remediation during construction
- (p) Safety and Security
- (q) Water Quality
- (r) Ecologically Sensitive Areas/Endangered Species
- (s) Wetlands/Flooding/Navigable Waterways and Coastal Zones
- (t) Wetland and Waters of the US Delineation
- (u) Section 404 Permits
- (v) Construction
- (w) Cumulative Impacts
- (x) Public Involvement

4.1.3 **Concept Designs/Preliminary Engineering:** The Consultant shall provide complete conceptual design drawings in accordance with all applicable laws and with regional design criteria and standards for public transit systems and assess any compatibility issues for transit routes and alignments through conceptual design that may require resolution. Project specific elements expected to be addressed through the concept design drawings task for various alternative alignments may include the following:

- (a) Transit Facilities such as maintenance facilities, transit centers, park-and-rides, bus stop improvements, etc.
- (b) Track-work Placement
- (c) Station Placement
- (d) Right-of-Way
- (e) Existing Utilities and Proposed Utilities
- (f) Roadway Plans
- (g) Traffic Signalization and optimization
- (h) Drainage
- (i) Traction Electrification
- (j) Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliance
- (k) Survey
- (l) Geotechnical Investigation

- (m) Bridge Structures assessment
- (n) Cost estimating
- (o) Risk assessment

4.1.4 **Major Transit Facility Studies:** The Consultant shall provide studies to establish and improve transit facilities in the region to support existing and future transit services. The studies may include evaluating opportunities for park and rides, transit centers, bus stops, operation and maintenance facilities, among other facilities. These studies may involve:

- (a) Assessing existing and future supply and demand
- (b) Impact of advances in alternative fuel and motor technologies on maintenance facility needs
- (c) Transit facility design/urban design
- (d) Conceptual site selection and development
- (e) Site planning
- (f) Cost estimating
- (g) Environmental documentation
- (h) Station are planning, including land use and zoning
- (i) Incorporation of joint development projects

4.1.5 **Community Relations/ Outreach Support**

- (a) The Consultant shall be able to assist all of the relative tasks associated with the development and implementation of Public Involvement Plans (PIP) support of the local needs associated with the project(s) within the area. Consultant may also be required to assist with public meetings on multiple projects of the MARTA system.
- (b) The Consultant shall provide all aspects of daily project duties including but not limited to: serving as the primary point of contact for assigned projects; managing and implementing community relation tasks at the direction of the MARTA Project Manager; establishing two-way working relationships with residents, business interest/owners and other stakeholders for assigned projects on behalf of the Department of Planning and Office of Transit Oriented Development and Real Estates. As directed by the assigned MARTA's Project Manager, Consultant shall provide coordination with sub-consultant, vendors or special interest groups; conduct stakeholder interviews and questionnaires; develop and produce reports; provide input to MARTA press releases; provide input on the utilization of social media tools to promote public involvement activities; develop Public Involvement Plan (PIP); plan and attend external client meetings, public meetings, outreach events and project team meetings.
- (c) Specific responsibilities related to Community Relations services include but are not limited to:
  - I. Establish effective working relationships with residents, business interests, and other stakeholders within an assigned area of a project;
  - II. Serve as a primary liaison between community interests and technical staff to

- establish and ensure open lines of communication;
- III. Assist with research, copywriting, proofing, production and dissemination of project materials (online, in print, via social media);
- IV. Assist with the coordination and interaction with transit and member agency officials, Consultants, and the general public and/or stakeholder groups;
- V. Route and/or respond to inquiries about the assigned project from the public to the Project Manager or other appropriate staff;
- VI. Arrange and schedule stakeholder meetings, public open houses, workshops, etc. regarding the project, based on direction from the Project Manager or other appropriate staff;
- VII. Provide timely and regular reports of community relations activities and input data in the stakeholder database;
- VIII. Conduct surveys to generate and collect public input related to projects. Utilize inputs to improve upon project or process;
- IX. Utilize new technology and practices that improve process and stakeholder engagement/feedback; and
- X. Support ad hoc writing, reporting and project management tasks as directed by the Assistant General Manager of Planning or the Senior Director of Transit System Planning.

#### **4.2 Transit Planning Support Services**

- 4.2.1 **Administrative Support:** The Consultant shall provide general administrative support including: word processing/formatting; text and graphics layout and manipulation; proofreading and editing documents; mail/e-mail list; photocopying and binding of documents and products; other duties as assigned to support the Department of Planning and Office of Transit Oriented Development.
- 4.2.2 **Feasibility Studies:** The Consultant shall provide a feasibility study of capital investment in proposed transit centers and corridors. This may include, among other specific tasks, identifying alternative transit service plans and land use scenarios that would result in sufficient transit trip generation and new riders so that the corridors under consideration could be considered a viable transit corridor.
- 4.2.3 **Environmental Analysis:** The Consultant shall provide special environmental studies in support of existing or proposed transit projects or facilities and support proposed service changes.
- 4.2.4 **Site/Alignment Selection:** The Consultant shall provide evaluation and selection of sites for transit facilities such as park and rides, transit centers, maintenance facilities etc. This task may also include identification of new transit route alignments or modification of existing transit service. Alignment selection criteria may include existing route performance, operating cost, population and employment densities served etc.
- 4.2.5 **Travel Forecasting:** The Consultant shall provide travel forecast results in support of various studies and planning efforts being undertaken by MARTA. Travel forecasting for other services such as fixed route bus services, paratransit and rideshare programs may also be required.

- 4.2.6 **System Configuration Planning:** The Consultant shall provide assessments and recommendations on how the planned regional transit system will function and operate and will identify supporting facility needs. For High Capacity Transit (HCT) system, Consultant will analyze the infrastructure requirements and recommend upgrades to the power supply, signal systems, parking requirements, transit centers, etc. For fixed route bus services, Consultant will analyze scheduling, blocking and fleet needs as well as interlining with other bus routes.
- 4.2.7 **Geographic Information Systems (GIS):** The Consultant shall provide GIS support for projects and studies identified by MARTA and partner agencies. Tasks may include collecting the data needed from other agencies, creating cartographic maps, creating GIS layers as well as converting Computer Aided Design (CAD) design drawings to GIS shapefiles and training of staff on future versions of ARCGIS, ARCEditor and ARCVIEW, etc.
- 4.2.8 **Planning Support Research:** The Consultant shall provide planning support for small research projects that may include researching best practices across the country for transit planning, operations and capital projects. Task may also include short studies to serve as input in formulation of MARTA policies.
- 4.2.9 **Planning and Programming:** MARTA is required to provide regular updates to the Regional Transit Plan (RTP), Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) and Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The Consultant shall be able to provide inputs to the RTP, TIP and/or UPWP programs including, but are not limited to, programs to bring in operational efficiencies, capital and preventative maintenance projects, etc.
- 4.2.10 **Graphics and Visual Renderings:** The Consultant shall provide visual renderings and animations for MARTA planning projects and studies. The Consultant must have the capability to provide photorealistic renderings for presentation purposes as needed. These may include conceptual design views, sketch graphics and 3D models which will not be duplicative of that which has been completed through other contracts.
- 4.2.11 **Data Collection and Transit Ridership Survey Support:** The Consultant shall provide assistance in data collection efforts or other needs as well as support for future transit ridership survey efforts which may include reviewing the sampling plan, survey instruments, data expansion methodology, etc.
- 4.2.12 **Fixed Route and Paratransit Service Planning:** The Consultant shall provide service planning support in short-, mid- and long-range service planning. The work effort under this task may include efficiency analysis, route scheduling/blocking/run-cutting, travel market identification and segmentation, ridership estimations, service cost estimating and other support for activities for items such as the scheduled service changes, Transit Development Plan and/or System Plan.
- 4.2.13 **Transit Operations Efficiency and Effectiveness Review:** The Consultant shall provide expertise in reviewing operational efficiencies and contractual performance on MARTA's fixed route and paratransit operations. The work effort under this task may include fixed route assessments per the agency approved transit standards and performance measures,

assessment of the implementation of paratransit study recommendations and monitoring of contractual obligations for the paratransit and fixed route operations.

**4.2.14 ADA Service and Facilities Compliance:** The Consultant shall provide support for projects and studies identified by MARTA and partner agencies which analyze and make recommendations for ADA compliance and best practices implementation.

**4.2.15 Sustainability:** The Consultant shall provide support for best practices in sustainability including data collection related to sustainability required for reporting to the American Public Transportation Association (APTA) in response to MARTA's APTA Sustainability Commitment. Additionally, the Consultant may also provide inputs to the agency's strategic plan for a sustainability program to support the planned expansion of the High Capacity Transit (HCT) and Light Rail Transit (LRT) system including incorporation of sustainable practices into the capital project design.

**4.2.16 Strategic Planning and Financial Programming:** The Consultant shall provide research and identify potential grant and other funding opportunities for operational and capital investments. This may also include financial programming for advancing the development of the high capacity component of the RTP and accompanying planning support.

**4.2.17 Federal Coordination/Consultation and Grant Applications:** The Consultant shall provide inputs to the Federal Transit Administration's proposed rulemakings, guidance and/or policy change and initiation. The Consultant shall provide strategic guidance and share best practices to advance MARTA's capital and operating program.

**4.2.18 Title VI Analysis:** The Consultant shall provide Title VI analysis related to the regional fare policy and structure, analysis of future HCT corridors, proposed service changes and reporting to the Federal Transit Authority (FTA) to ensure federal compliance.

**4.2.19 Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Planning:** The Consultant shall provide expertise and best practices in ITS improvements for transit capital and operations projects. This may include developing strategies for implementing transit signal priority, transportation demand management, dynamic mobility platforms etc. The Consultant will also support the development of an agency ITS strategic plan.

#### **4.3 Transit Oriented Development (TOD) and Real Estate**

**4.3.1 TOD Planning Assistance:** The Consultant shall provide support to the Office of Transit Oriented Development and Real Estate on joint development and transit-oriented development initiatives in existing and future transit corridors. This may include real estate market analysis, development feasibility analysis, strategic planning, data support, etc. The Consultant may also review development proformas and provide guidance on innovative funding mechanisms. This may include coordinating with member agencies, non-profit organizations on joint development and/or redevelopment projects adjacent to transit facilities.

**4.3.2 Real Estate Assistance:** The Consultant shall provide support to the Office of Transit Oriented Development and Real Estate on real estate initiatives within MARTA's service

areas. This may include, but not limited to, strategic plans to leverage MARTA's real estate assets, software development and re-development project adjacent to transit facilities.

- 4.3.3 **Concessions Programming and Development:** The Consultant shall provide planning and technical assistance with the implementation and management of the retail concessions program at MARTA.



**EXHIBIT B**  
**SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

The following special terms and conditions modify and amend the Contract terms and conditions specifically referenced herein. In the event of a conflict between the terms and conditions contained in this Exhibit B and the balance of the Contract, the terms and conditions set forth in this Exhibit B shall control.

1. **LICENSES / TAXES.** The Consultant shall, have throughout the term of the Contract, maintain in good standing licenses/permits required by Local, County, and State Authorities at its sole expense. The Authority is exempt from the payment of sales and uses taxes and will provide the Consultant with certification of tax-exempt status upon request. The Consultant shall pay all applicable taxes.
2. **MARTA CODE OF ETHICS.** The resulting contract between the Authority and your firm is governed by the attached MARTA Code of Ethics and Standards of Conduct. The MARTA Code of Ethics and Standards of Conduct was adopted by the MARTA Board of Directors on August 12, 2013. You are encouraged to review the referenced link for Code of Ethics and Standards of Conduct so you may be familiar with the Authority's standards of conduct. **EXHIBIT C**  
**WORK ORDER PROCEDURES**

**1.0 STATEMENT OF PURPOSE.**

- 1.1 This document outlines the internal procedures that govern the work order process from the initiation of work orders over \$10,000.
- 1.2 The Authority's Technical Representative will use these procedures for the selection of consulting firm(s) for work order assignments of specific projects under the Planning Support and Technical Services Contract.
- 1.3 The procedures outlined in this document may be revised from time to time, as required, to reflect the changing needs of the Authority. Any changes will be consistent with the Planning Support and Technical Services Contract.

**2.0 DEFINITIONS.**

Qualified Consultants – The firm(s) awarded specific scope of services in the Planning Support and Technical Services Contract.

Technical Representative – The person the Authority designated as a representative, pursuant to the Planning Support and Technical Services Contract.

WOPR – Work Order Proposal Request

**3.0 PROCEDURES.**

**3.1 Work Order Request**

- A. General - The Authority will prepare a Work Order Proposal Request ("WOPR") for a specific project. The requested services shall fall under the Scope of Work, as outlined in the Planning Support and Technical Services Contract.
- B. Under certain circumstances, a WOPR may be sent to a single qualified Consultant; in these cases, a Single Qualified Consultant Justification Form will need to accompany the WOPR.
- C. The WOPR shall contain a statement of work which identifies the details of the project. At a minimum, the statement of work shall include the work to be performed, location of work, period of performance, deliverable schedule, applicable standards, acceptance criteria, and any special requirements.
- D. The WOPR shall contain a request to the consultants to submit a price proposal under one of the compensation methods provided in Section 7 (Compensation) of the Contract.
- E. The WOPR may ask the consultants, if necessary or appropriate, to submit a project plan for performing the work.

- F. The WOPR shall notify the consultants of the evaluation criteria that will be used to determine the consultant to receive the work order.
- G. The WOPR should contain information regarding the submittal of proposals. At a minimum, the Request should state the deadline for submitting proposals.

### 3.2 Notice of the WOPR

The Work Order Request shall be sent to each of the appropriate qualified consultants. A Request is an invitation for the qualified consultants to submit a proposal to perform the services.

### 3.3 Response to WOPR

Qualified consultants shall submit written proposals or “No Response” statements in response to the Request. All responses shall be sent to the Authority’s Technical Representative, or the person identified in the Request, by the deadline stated the Request.

### 3.4 Evaluation of the Proposals and Selection of Consultant

- A. An Evaluation Committee will be established to review and evaluate the Work Order Proposals. The committee shall consist of three members, Sr. Mgr. Infrastructure Eng., Mgr. Engineering Svcs. and a Subject Matter Expert (SME), as deemed by the Authority.
- B. The Evaluation Committee will evaluate the proposals using the criteria identified in the Request.
- C. Work Orders will be assigned at MARTA’s discretion based on multiple factors, which may include, but are not limited to: availability of consultant staff resources and MARTA’s schedule requirements, consultant capabilities in specialized areas required for the work order, responsiveness and attentiveness to requests and other work orders assigned to date.
- D. The Authority will notify the consultants of the selection results.
- E. The Authority will prepare documentation for a Work order assignment. The approval document for the Work order assignment will include a clear justification for the selection of the consulting firm(s) and will be placed in the official contract administration file.

### 3.5 Assignment of Work Order

The Authority will issue a Work Order to the selected consultant. At the time of issuance, the Work Order is incorporated into the Contract for Planning Support and Technical Services.

### 3.6 Implementation of Work Order

The selected consultant is authorized to start work on the date indicated in the Work Order.

### 3.7 Close Out of Work Order

When the Work Order performance is completed, the Authority’s Technical Representative must sign the acceptance of the final product or completion statement for all Works issued ensuring that all Work order requirements were met.

**EXHIBIT D**  
**ADDITIONAL INSURANCE AND BONDING REQUIREMENTS**

A. Preamble

The following requirements apply to all work under the Contractor. Compliance is required by the Contractor. **To the extent permitted by applicable law, the Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority ("MARTA") reserves the right to adjust or waive any insurance or bonding requirements contained in this Exhibit D.**

1. Evidence of Insurance Required Before Work Begins

**No work under the Contractor may be commenced until all insurance and bonding requirements contained in this Exhibit D, or required by applicable law, have been complied with and evidence of such compliance satisfactory to MARTA as to form and content has been filed with MARTA.** Contractor must provide MARTA with a Certificate of Insurance that clearly and unconditionally indicates that Contractor has complied with all insurance and bonding requirements set forth in this Exhibit D. If the Contractor is a joint venture, the insurance certificate should name the joint venture, rather than the joint venture partners individually, as the primary insured.

2. Minimum Financial Security Requirements

All companies providing insurance required by this Exhibit D must meet certain minimum financial security requirements. These requirements must conform to the ratings published by A.M. Best & Co. in the current Best's Key Rating Guide. The ratings for each company must be indicated on the documentation provided by Contractor to MARTA certifying that all insurance and bonding requirements set forth in this Exhibit D and applicable to the Contract have been unconditionally satisfied.

For all agreements, regardless of size, companies providing insurance or bonds under the Contract must meet the following requirements:

- (a) Best's Rating not less than A-;
- (b) Best's Financial Size Category not less than Class IX; and
- (c) Companies must be authorized to conduct and transact insurance contracts by the Insurance Commissioner, State of Georgia; and
- (d) All bid, performance and payment bonds must be underwritten by a U.S. Treasury Circular 570 listed company.

If the issuing company does not meet these minimum requirements, or for any other reason is or becomes unsatisfactory to MARTA, MARTA will notify Contractor in writing. Contractor must promptly obtain a new policy or bond issued by an insurer acceptable to MARTA and submit to MARTA evidence of its compliance with these conditions.

Contractor's failure to comply with all insurance and bonding requirements set forth in this Exhibit D and applicable to the Contract will not relieve Contractor from any liability under the Contract. Contractor's obligations to comply with all insurance and bonding requirements set forth in Exhibit D and applicable to the Contract will not be construed to conflict with or limit Contractor's indemnification obligations under the Contract.

3. Insurance Required for Duration of Contract

All insurance and bonds required by this Exhibit D must be maintained during the entire term of the Contract, including any renewal or extension thereof, and until all work has been completed to the satisfaction of MARTA.

4. Notices of Cancellation & Renewal

Contractor must, notify MARTA in writing at the address listed below by mail, hand-delivery or facsimile transmission, within two (2) days of any notices received from any insurance carriers providing insurance coverage under this Contract and Exhibit D that concern the proposed cancellation, or termination of coverage.

Confirmation of any mailed notices must be evidenced by return receipts of registered or certified mail.

Contractor shall provide MARTA with evidence of required insurance prior to the commencement of the Contract, and, thereafter, with a certificate evidencing renewals or changes to required policies of insurance at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of previously provided certificates.

5. Agent Acting as Authorized Representative

Each and every agent acting as authorized representative on behalf of a company affording coverage under this contract shall warrant when signing the Acord Certificate of Insurance that specific authorization has been granted by the companies for the agent to bind coverage as required and to execute the Acord Certificates of Insurance as evidence of such coverage. MARTA coverage requirements may be broader than the original policies; these requirements have been conveyed to the companies for these terms and conditions. In addition, each and every agent shall warrant when signing the Acord Certificate of Insurance that the agent is licensed to do business in the State of Georgia and that the company or companies are currently in good standing in the State of Georgia.

6. Certificate Holder

MARTA must be named as certificate holder. All notices must be mailed to the attention of **Director of Risk Management at 2424 Piedmont Road N.E., Atlanta, Georgia 30324-3330.**

7. Contract Number & Name

The contract number and name must be referenced in the description section of the insurance certificate.

8. Additional Insured Endorsements – Form CG 20 26 07 04 or their carrier equivalent

MARTA shall be covered as an Additional Insured, as its interest may appear, under any and all insurance required pursuant to this Contract, and such insurance shall be primary and non-contributory with respect to the Additional Insured. However, this requirement does not apply to Workers' Compensation or Professional Liability Insurance. Additional insured status extending to ongoing and completed operations per CG 20 26 07 04 or their carrier equivalent shall be provided. Additional insured status shall be maintained following project completion equivalent to the statute of repose in the State of Georgia. A copy of the Additional Insured Endorsement or its equivalent must be forwarded to MARTA's Department of Risk Management as soon as practicable but in no event more than ten (10) days after the execution date of the Contract.

9. Mandatory Sub-Contractor Compliance

Contractor must require and ensure that all subcontractors at all tiers to be sufficiently insured/bonded.

10. Self-Insured Retentions, Deductibles or Similar Obligations

Any self-insured retention, deductible or similar obligation will be the sole responsibility of the contractor.

11. Task Order / Work Order

Evidence of compliance with insurance requirements must be provided on a Task Order / Work Order basis prior to the issuance of any Notice to Proceed.

B. Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance

Contractor must procure and maintain Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance in the following limits to cover each employee who is or may be engaged in work under the Contract:

C. Commercial General Liability Insurance

Contractor must procure and maintain Commercial General Liability Insurance on form (CG 00 00 01 or equivalent) in an amount not less than **\$1,000,000 per occurrence** and must include contractual liability coverage to provide for the indemnification obligations of the Contractor under the Contract. The following indicated extensions of coverage must be provided (only if the box is checked):

- ☒ Contractual Liability
- ☒ Broad Form Property Damage
- ☒ Premises Operations
- ☒ Medical Expense
- ☒ Independent Contractor/Subcontractor
- ☒ Additional Insured Endorsement\* (primary& non-contributing in favor of MARTA)

- ☒ Waiver of Subrogation in favor of MARTA
- ☒ Waiver of any exclusion regarding loss or damage to property caused by explosion or resulting from collapse of buildings or structures or damage to property underground, commonly referred to by insurers as the "XCU" hazards

D. Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions) Insurance

Limits of not less than **\$1,000,000** that shall remain in effect during the term of the Contract and for a period of at least three years after the Contract expires (or is earlier terminated) and for the duration of the State of Georgia's Statute of Repose. Such policy shall cover all of the Contractor's professional liabilities, whether resulting from the actions of the Contractor or its employees, subcontractors or agents, arising out of Services performed under or in accordance with the Contract.

E. Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance

Contractor must procure and maintain Automobile Liability Insurance in an amount not less than **\$250,000** Bodily Injury and Property Damage combined single limit. The following indicated extensions of coverage must be provided (only if the box is checked):

- ☒ Owned, Non-owned & Hired Vehicles
- ☒ Waiver of Subrogation in favor of MARTA

If Contractor does not own any automobiles in the corporate name, non-owned vehicle coverage will apply and must be endorsed on either Contractor's personal automobile policy or the Commercial General Liability coverage required under this Exhibit

F. Excess or Umbrella Liability Insurance

The following indicated extensions of coverage must be provided (only if the box is checked):

G. Property Coverage/Inland Marine

Contractor shall procure and maintain all risk property coverage in an amount equal to replacement value for all of Contractor's equipment, furniture, fixtures, machinery and/ or personal property.

H. Performance and Payment Bonds. None
